OTHER DAYS.

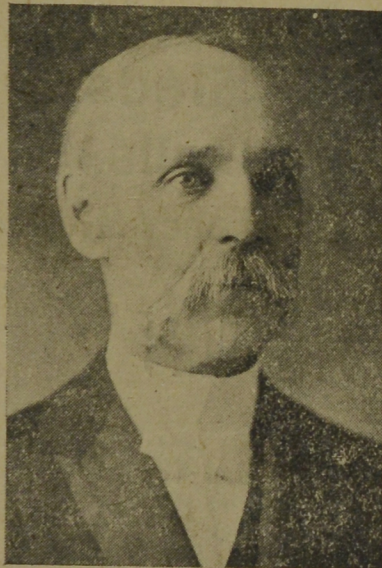


The fiftieth anniversary of the dedication of the Methodist church will be observed tomorrow. All the services will be of a special character, and Mr. Wilmot Lemont, choir master, has arranged musical selections appropriate to the occasion.
