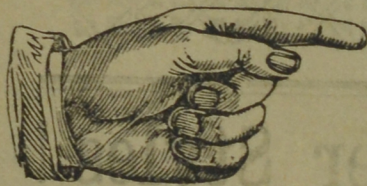

Where Women May Not Pray.

There is a practically universal prohibition against women praying in Mohammedan countries. Some Hindoo congregations deny the privilege of prayer to their women altogether. Among the Ainu, a race supposed to be the aborigines of Japan, women are not permitted to pray or offer sacrifice except in rare cases as the deputies of their husbands. The reason for this practice is that the Ainu women are not supposed to possess souls, and therefore their prayers would be quite unavailing. Among the natives of Madagascar women are permitted to pray, but only to the powers of evil, a kind of intercessory prayer. Only men are permitted to address prayers directly to the Supreme Being.

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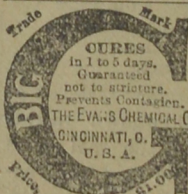
