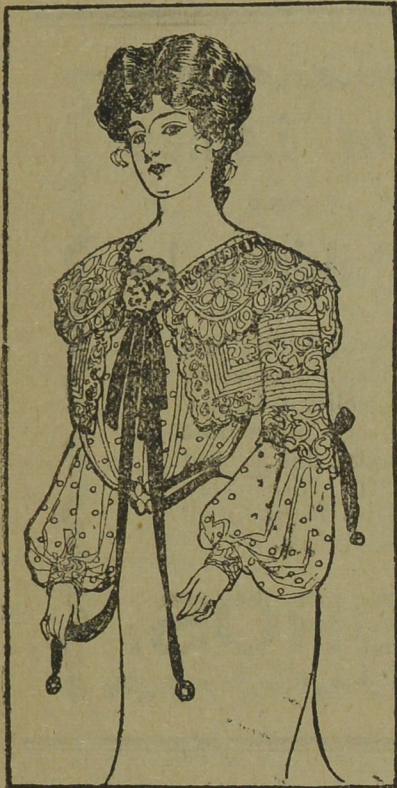

The new stockings are of very fine patterns. A great deal of openwork effect will be worn.

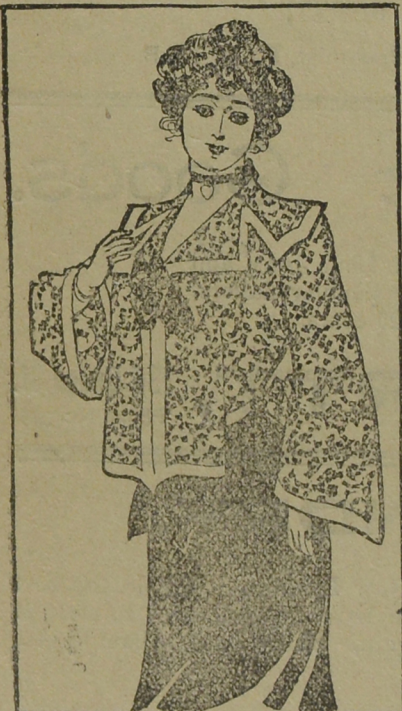

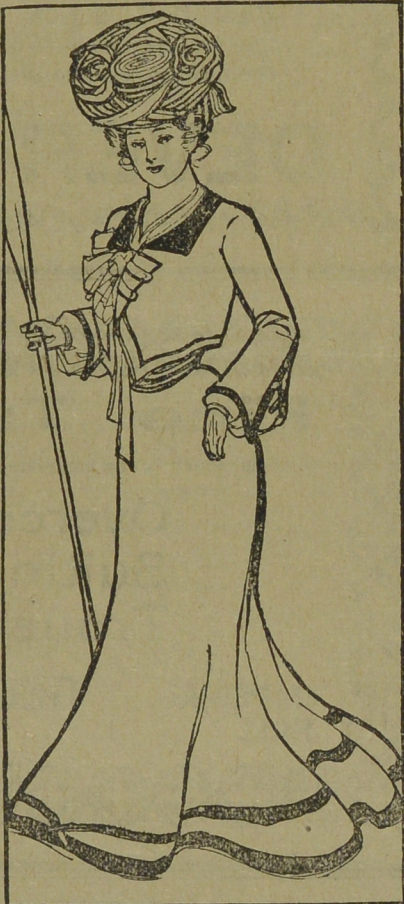

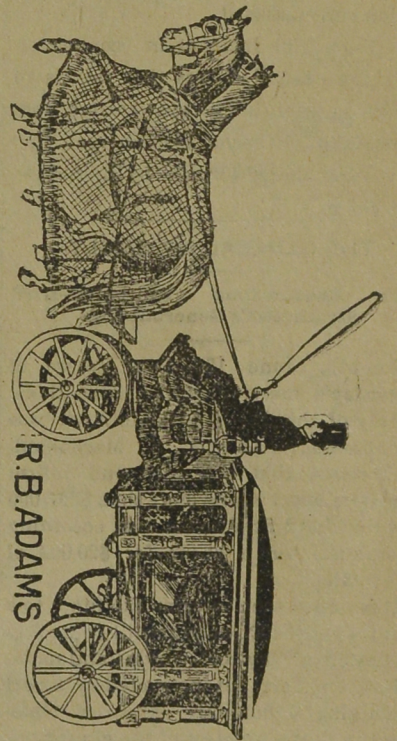
