

GRAND RECEPTION.

Very Pleasant Successful
Social Function in the
Assembly Chamber.

**NEARLY FIVE HUNDRED LADIES
AND GENTLEMEN**

Paid Their Respects to His
Honor and Mrs. Snowball.

The Legislative Assembly Chamber yesterday afternoon was the scene of a very brilliant and attractive social event, when His Honor, the Lieut. Governor and Mrs. Snowball gave their first official reception. Fully five hundred ladies and gentlemen, representing nearly every part of the province, were present to pay their respects to His Honor and his esteemed lady, and the galleries were literally packed with spectators who found interest and pleasure in witnessing the presentations.

As soon as the Legislature had adjourned, the members' desks and chairs were cleared away, and the Governor and Mrs. Snowball, attended by Private Secretary Barker and Col. Call, Col. McLean and Capt. Lister, A. D. C.'s, took up a position in front of the throne, and for an hour, from 4 to 5 o'clock, there was a steady stream of ladies and gentlemen being presented to His Honor and his lady, each one being introduced by Private Secretary Barker.

The curtains of the Chamber were drawn, the gas lighted, and the effect of the many pretty costumes of the ladies, mingling with the bright uniforms of the military and the more sombre garb of the gentlemen in afternoon dress was very attractive. Hanlon's orchestra stationed near the press quarters played a fine programme of music.

The reception was one of the largest seen here for many years, and all were impressed with the kindly manner of His Honor and Mrs. Snowball, whose social popularity so well recognized for the North Shore is already established in Fredericton.
