

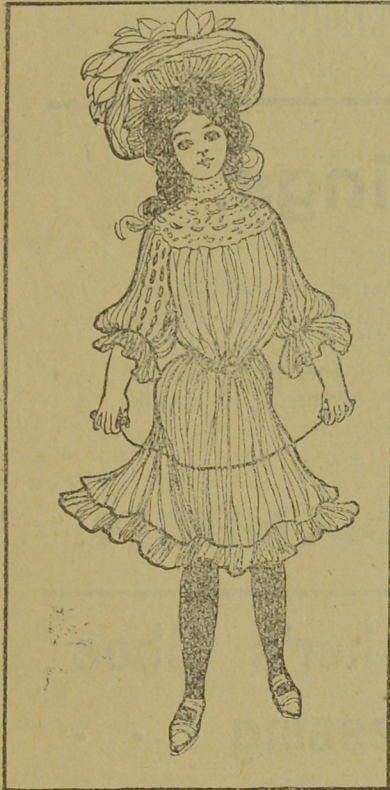
WHAT WOMEN ARE WEARING

Elbow Sleeves In Vogue — Pouched Waists.

Elbow sleeves are in great favor, but the long, clinging sleeves of transparent net or lace are too becoming to be ignored by the fashionable.

The lace collar is worn a great deal, and so are cascades and fichu arrangements or collars of lace put on very full and draped on the fronts in same fashion.

pale blue silk linings. The belt, sleeve rosettes and collar are of pale blue ribbon to match the lining.

Materials made up without linings frequently have the waist pouching both back and front. The pouching in the back is merely a trifle, but it gives a careless and rather smart effect which the waist would not have if the thin substance were drawn down plain.

The waist has no collar and is ornamented with a deep round yoke of yellow lace run through with narrow black velvet ribbon. The sleeves are very full and terminate below the elbow with a deep frill.
