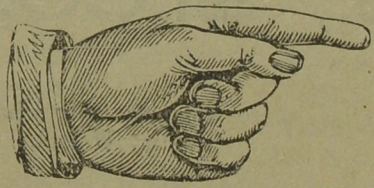

MR. ST. JOHN BRODRICK.

Presentation to British War Secretary by Broderers' Company.

In recognition of "his distinguished patriotism amidst many difficulties," Mr. St. John Brodrick, British Secretary for War, was recently presented with the honorary freedom and livery of the Broderers' Company. It is stated that Mr. Brodrick's family have been associated with the Broderers' Company since 1620, when one William Brodrick left a sum of money for the relief of poorer members of the guild. The presentation was made in a handsome casket. The Broderers' Company, The London Chronicle explains, is one of the very few Livery Companies which distinguished themselves by declining to render an account of their property to the London Livery Companies Commission of 1880. The company to-day consists of three and thirty gentlemen who go to make up the court and livery of the Broderers' Company, and, though it declines to give any account of its present income, most sane men can guess the approximate value to-day of a message and two cottages in Cutter Lane, valued when left in 1568 at \$2 16s. 8d. annually. Among other Broderers, or Embroiderers whom the new Brodrick will meet in his company are his father, Lord Middleton, and Viscount Horncastle, C.C., and Aldermen Evans and Wilkin, and some thirty other gentlemen who "Broder" in a Pickwickian sense indeed. Each member of the court receives two guineas for each attendance upon the court business. Their livery consists of a blue coat and breeches, with a white waistcoat and stockings, and a white cravat.

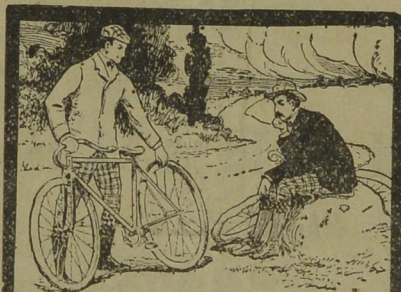
PRINCESS RADZIWIŁŁ.

Sketch of the Career of This Titled Adventurer Now in Prison.

Princess Katharine Radziwiłł, who has just been sentenced to two years in prison at Cape Town, comes of an old Polish family, that of Rzewuska. She married Prince William Radziwiłł, and one of her three children is now Princess Blucher. She resided for some years in St. Petersburg, and then in Berlin. It was during a casual visit to London that she first met Mr. Rhodes. Those who believe in the "evil eye," will find confirmation of their superstition in the fact that no less than three people concerned in the case or mixed up with the Princess' affairs have died since criminal proceedings were first instituted against her—to wit, Mr. Rhodes, Dr. Scholtz of Cape Town, and Captain Pentold, a director of the De Beers Company. Princess Radziwiłł visited Cape Town in 1900, her object, it was said, being to sow dissension between Government House, to which she had letters of introduction, and Groot Schuur, by repeating to Mr. Rhodes wholly imaginary conversations she had had with Lord (then Sir Alfred) Milner. She is given the credit for the discovery of a new medium of intrigue—the typewriter. To many persons of standing she had read private instructions she professed to have received from the highest authorities in England, the Prime Minister among them, of an extraordinary and even a startling character. When asked whether the Princess showed them the originals, the uniform reply was, "No, they were typewritten copies, which she used to avoid the danger of losing the originals." It was said that she was acting for Dr. Leyds.

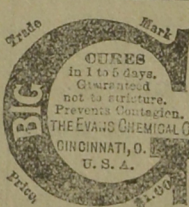
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
