

## A NERVY GERMAN.

Served Under Prince Henry in Navy and Pushed His Way Into Embassy to Greet Former Commander.

Washington, March 1.—As the Prince was about to start for the Capitol at 11:30 o'clock an incident occurred showing his democratic manners. When he came down the Embassy stairway, a young man with German features pushed through the brilliantly uniformed throng and saluted immediately in front of His Royal Highness. The unexpected visitor, Henry William Haschenburger, of Baltimore, explained that he had served for seventeen months on the German cruiser Irene while Prince Henry commanded the ship. At considerable risk he had overcome all barriers and was within the private quarters of the Embassy.

The Prince seemed to enjoy the sailor's enthusiasm. He remembered his service, and greeted him most cordially.

## A MAN WITH IRON NERVE.

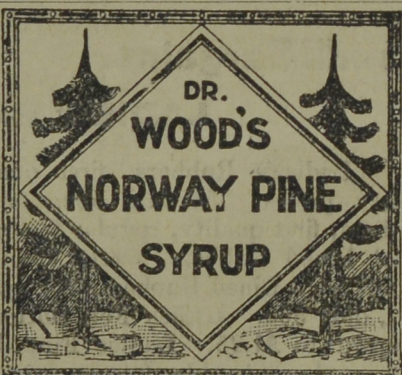
Sackville Murderer Heard His Doom Unflinchingly.

Boston, March 1.—In a short time John C. Best, a former resident of Sackville, N. B., will be sentenced to be electrocuted for the murder of Geo. E. Bailey at Break Heart Hill farm, North Saugus, in the fall of 1900. The supreme court of the commonwealth has over-ruled the exceptions taken by Best's counsel at the trial. There is now practically no hope that the convicted man can escape the death penalty.

Best, when informed of the court's decision, did not turn a hair. A smile constantly played around the corners of his mouth as he listened attentively to the reading of the certified copy of the decision. He was apparently as much interested as a man would be in reading a story, and at its conclusion, when the two final words fell from the lips of the lawyer "exceptions overruled," Best turned his face toward Mr. Sisk and actually laughed, at the same time saying: "Well, Sisk, what's the next move in this game?"

Mental derangement apparently caused Aleck Ikey, of Wells, Vermont, to kill his wife with an axe. The tragedy was enacted in the pantry of the farm house in Wells, occupied by the family, which included a son and daughter. Mrs. Ikey was instantly killed, and had no warning of the blows struck. Ikey then went into the sitting room and awoke his son, who was asleep, and told of his act. The son sent for the town constable and Ikey was taken to Rutland for safe-keeping.

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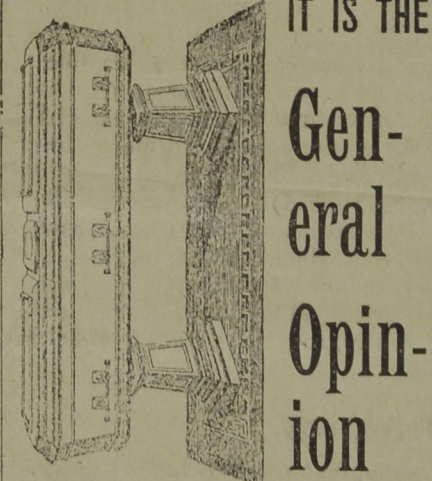
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
