The referee in equity finds that the firm of J. A. and W. Vanwart was dissolved in 1892, after which the testator conducted a legal business on his own account. Shortly after the dissolution J. A. Vanwart, the senior member of the firm, was appointed to the Supreme Court bench. The contention put forth

by claimants that the partnership was never dissolved was not sustained by the referee.

The total amount disbursed by Willard Kitchen in his capacity as administrator is given at \$4,810 53

The amount received by Mr. Kitchen from the sale of real estate belonging to Mr. Vanwart at the time of his death was \$142 00, and from the sale of real estate belonging to Mrs. Annie L. Vanwart and deeded to him he received \$275.

The total amount collected by the administrator, and which is available for creditors was given at \$31,864 63. Of this amount \$28,225 09 was from life insurance policies collected as follows:

The referee reported that the life insurance received by Mrs. Annie Vanwart, widow of the testator, was \$52,500, and that the amount paid in premiums on this was \$17,688 39. Mrs. Vanwart made no claim against the estate, though the accounts show that she had loaned the testator \$1,526 30, and that he had retained for his own use the sum of \$1,508 28 due her as one of the heirs of the late George Home.

The amount paid in funeral expenses for the testator was \$101 75.

The claimants have fourteen days in which to file objections to the referee's report, and if none are filed, A. J. Gregory, K.C., will, at the next sitting of the Equity court in December, move to have the report confirmed.

It is estimated that the amount available for creditors is between fifty and sixty cents on the dollar.

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
