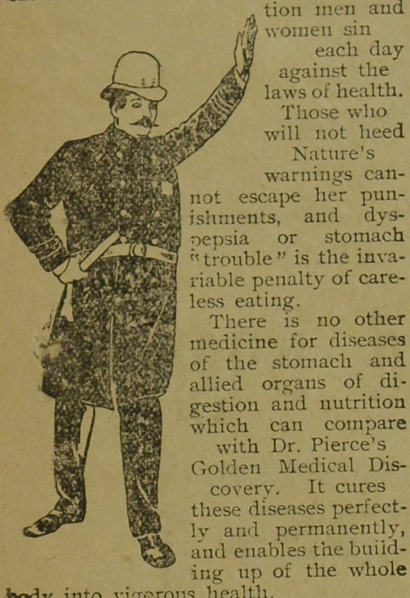


The Law

Satisfied With Our Leather.

In his report at the annual meeting of the Tanners' Section of the Toronto Board of Trade the chairman, Mr. W. J. Bickell, called attention to the part which the tanners took in connection with the war in South Africa. He pointed out that thousands of sides of our leather were made into saddles and other military accoutrements, as well as considerable quantities of boots, leggings, etc., and as far as we can learn, proved entirely satisfactory. We should feel proud that we can manufacture leather, and that we have connected with our trade men who can build military accoutrements that will pass the strict examination of the military authorities at Southampton. Instances have been cited in which shoes made in Canada have seen a full year's service in Africa, and returned in fair condition. Similar reports have been made by different officers regarding the saddles and other military equipment of Canadian manufacture, which gave universal satisfaction to the troops.

New Oyster Grounds.

Mr. Ernest Kempf, oyster expert for the Fisheries Department, has returned to Ottawa to prepare his report on the operations of his branch during the past season. Mr. Kempf has been especially engaged in preparing a new bed in Annapolis Basin. It will be planted early in the spring. The oyster grounds in Murray Harbor, Prince Edward Island, which were planted during the summer of 1900, are showing up well.

Use Wood Instead of Coal.

The Bancroft Times says that wood is used to "fire up" with on the Irondale, Bancroft & Ottawa Railway in Hastings county. To see a train steaming along at night is to witness a first-class display of fireworks.

Lake St. Clair-Lake Erie Canal.

Details of the proposed Lake St. Clair-Lake Erie Canal are given in The Engineering News. As at present outlined the canal will be thirteen and one-half miles long, through low-lying land, with the underlying rock more than 20 feet below the bottom of the deepest cut. A uniform depth of 21 feet is proposed, with a canal 156 feet wide on the surface and 72 feet wide on the bottom. This canal would enable vessels to avoid the fogs, shoals and rapid current of the Detroit River, and would afford a straight course from the St. Clair flats canal and an offing in Lake Erie. The course would be unimpeded by locks, and a speed of six miles an hour could be maintained. The saving in distance by the canal would be 79 miles, between the foot of the St. Clair flats canal and an offing in Lake Erie. In time the saving would be six or seven hours. No estimate of cost is given, but the promoters of the canal claim that there would be a net saving of \$1,000,000 per year on the 40,000,000 tons of freight now annually passing through the Detroit River.

A Prisoner of Riel.

Rev. John Henderson, Methodist minister at Minto, Manitoba, has sent an account of the burial of the late James Jock. The latter, he wrote, was a veteran of the Northwest rebellion. He was made a prisoner by Louis Riel along with Scott, but was released together with some others, while poor Scott was shot. Mr. Jock was a very active man and traveled a great deal. He had a bright memory and was famous as a raconteur. He farmed on the banks of the Souris river, and after two years' illness died at the age of 74. He was buried in Minto cemetery, Rev. Mr. Henderson officiating.

Chimneys That Lean.

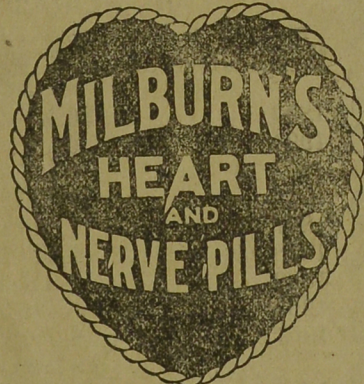
