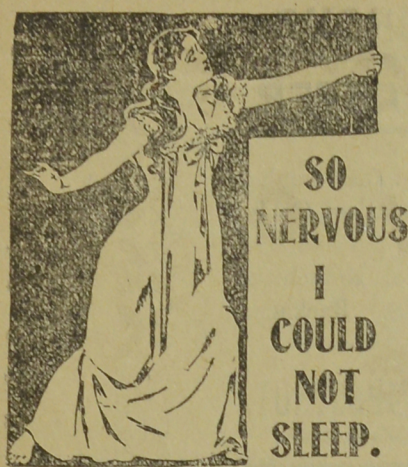

Moral.—When a person thinks he is better than others, he should carefully avoid the looking glass.

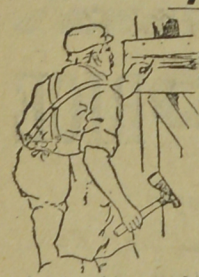
An Odd Betrothal.

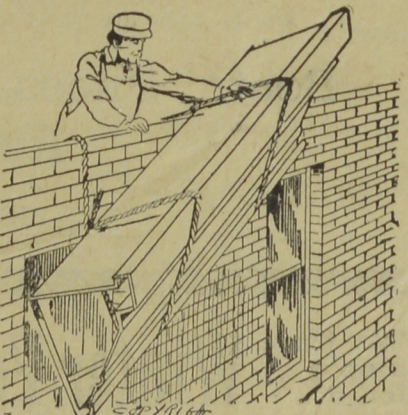
