OTTAWA LETTER.

(Continued from Second Page.)

BLAMED THE PRINTER AGAIN.

Mr. Pugsley, then showed another glaring error in the report. Speaking of the company's stock, the report says: "Responsible and respectable men from various parts of the province were obtained to lend their names as directors; and from the act that \$430,000 of the total \$500,000 authorized capital was to be distributed as founders' shares, we conclude that the interested parties had visions of ultimate large profits, with the absolute certainty of no personal loss."

The explanation given of this is that the figures should be \$43,000, not \$430,000; that the error was typographical. It is worthy of notice that the commissioners did not correct this error, the original figures were allowed to go to the country, and do their part towards ruining the reputation of a public man, and the correction was made by Mr. Pugsley amid cheers.

RECKLESS AND CONTRADICTORY.

Then again the report says: "So much of the facts are given to show absolute want of bookkeeping." A little later in the report these words appear: "Mr. Shannon had the benefit of Mr. Evans' statement, the books of the James Barnes Construction Company," providing that the report was wild and reckless. Then again, while in one place in the report it says there was an absolute want of bookkeeping, in another place they say "Books of account in connection with the operation of the railway were kept in the company's office at Norton." These books, besides showing the revenue and operating expenses, show the amounts expended for betterments outside the cost of construction of the fifteen-mile section and branches, and were well kept."

This report says first, that no books were kept, which accounts for the jumble into which affairs got, and showing all outgoings and incomings, and they were well kept. It is upon a report such as this that a reputation is sought to be blasted.

WHO ARE THE COMMISSIONERS

Referring to the commissioners, Mr. Pugsley said he had "great respect for the bench, but if any gentleman should tell him that Judge Landry was specially selected for his great eminence in his profession, I should feel that he had little knowledge of the transaction of legal business in the province of New Brunswick, and

but little knowledge of the leading counsel who appear before the various courts of the province." Mr. Macdougall, another commissioner was manager of a little branch of the oval bank, and had been so for years. Mr. Powell was a Conservative politician and ex-candidate, coquetted with both political parties.

Judge Landry, said Mr. Pugsley, had on the eve of a general election to be a candidate for one of them. "This prevented his mind from settling down to that judicial calm necessary to enable one to adorn the high position of a judge."

Although the report stated what amount of interest should be charged, Mr. Pugsley showed that in response to a question asked in the New Brunswick House, the Government had declined to bring down a return upon the ground of the time it would involve and the great expense attaching to it. How, then, said Mr. Pugsley, could these commissioners arrive at any accurate figures in this regard.

PUT THEM IN A HOLE.

The report says also that the cost of the road was excessive, that \$11,000 a mile was ample for this. In this connection Mr. Hazen, Conservative Premier of New Brunswick, has been urging the Federal government to increase the subsidy upon the ground that the road would cost \$21,000 per mile. All this in the face of the report of his own commission that the road should be built for \$11,000 per mile.

Dr. Pugsley selected at random through the report about twenty-five explicit statements, purporting to be statements of fact, and literally tore them to shreds. He proved by facts, figures, quotations from official documents that the commissioners had not been careful, but had made statements contrary to the evidence, and utterly at variance with the facts. He concluded by submitting a financial statement of the affairs of the company, which gave in detail the receipts and expenditures, and disposed effectually of the suggestion that any money had been wrongfully applied.

Amid cheers which shook the building and discomfited his assailants, Hon. Mr. Pugsley said he would now retire from the chamber so as not to embarrass the discussion. In doing this he acted strictly in accordance with English precedent on like occasions, a fact in respect of which many opposition members appear to be ignorant.

ROCK HITS ENGINE

C. P. R. Locomotive Is Crushed Beneath Huge Boulder.

TRAIN NARROWLY ESCAPES

While Traveling Along Mountainous Section of Line Between Mattawa and Kippewa Passenger Train Is Almost Forced Over a Precipice by Huge Rock Slide—Freight Train Telescopes Another.

North Bay, May 14.—A serious accident occurred on the Kippewa branch of the C.P.R. between Mattawa and Kippewa. That no casualties occurred is almost miraculous. The railway runs north from Mattawa to the foot of Lake Temiskaming, and winds its way through the Laurentians, along narrow ledges far above the Ottawa river, and through many huge rock cuttings.

As the passenger train north, heavily laden, was passing through a particularly dangerous section, where the road bed clings to the mountain side, with the river many feet below, a five-ton rock crashed down the declivity, wrecking the locomotive, but fortunately not forcing the train over the precipice. Passengers were severely shaken up by the sudden stop, but not seriously injured.

So tightly was the engine wedged by the immense rock that dynamite had to be utilized to clear the wreckage.

At Woman river, on the C.P.R., 200 miles west of North Bay, a freight train telescoped another freight standing at the station, smashing up several cars and seriously injuring Conductor Lavie of Chapleau, who was in his van when the crash came.

English Capital for Prince Rupert.

Vancouver, B.C., May 13.—Moreton Frewen, a distinguished English capitalist and representative of English capital, which will become heavily interested in the Grand Trunk Pacific townsites at Prince Rupert, is now off to Montreal to consult with President Hays of the Grand Trunk relative to the establishment of some large industrial undertakings at the Pacific terminus. Frewen is in a hurry, because he has to be back in Vancouver in time for the commencement of the Prince Rupert auction sale. Exactly what his plans are, he declares he is not prepared to state till he has had another meeting with Hays. It is reported, however, that several millions of dollars are involved.

To Invest in Millions.

Vancouver, B.C., May 14.—The investment of two million dollars in the halibut industry with Prince Rupert as a base is planned by a wealthy English syndicate recently organized. Sylvester Swettenham, brother of Sir Frank Swettenham, who is associated with business enterprises in which the banking house of Glyn Mills & Co. is concerned, has reached here on a mission in connection with the proposed enterprise. He also plans to establish numerous salmon canneries along the Skeena river.

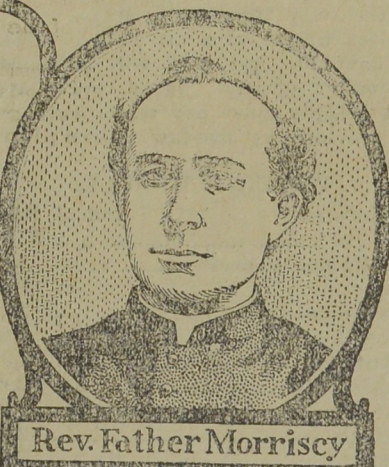
