STRIKE BREAKERS ARRIVE.**Large Number of Expert Miners Taking the Place of U. M. W. Men.**

Glouce Bay, N. S., July 26.—The steamer Stigstad arrived at Sydney from Montreal yesterday morning with a number of men who were sent to the colliers where they will be employed. Today she loaded a cargo of coal and returned to Montreal.

The steamer Cabot arrived this morning from Chatham, N. B., via Cheticamp, C. B., from which port she brought 100 men, most of whom are expert miners who formerly worked in the collieries. These will be distributed in the various mines of the Dominion Coal Company.

Thus the company is gradually filling up the ranks broken up by the strikers throughout the works again.

The company is proceeding with the serving of notices to strikers that they must leave the houses owned by the company. The strike leaders some time ago announced that they would take care of all their men in tents until the end of the strike. The men, however, for the most part, have intimated to the leaders that they will not live in tents.

Some foreigners upon whom notices to leave houses were served, have reported to the company that they desire to return to work and that they would have done so before but for the reason that they were threatened by the strike leaders.

General Manager Duggan says that every one of the collieries is better off today in the number of men employed, and he looks forward to a substantial

increase from the pits during the coming week.

The day's slightly lessened output was because of rainy weather and the decrease was from the banks, and not from the pits. The total production was 9,161 tons.

The question of an all-Canadian union based upon a dissolution of the P. W. A. and U. M. W. was submitted today to a meeting of the miners by Rev. Messrs. Feaver and Goddard Fenwick. The discussion was taken part in by the miners, who stated that they had been deprived of work simply because they had joined the U. M. W. They spoke also of that tyranny from bosses and otherwise expressed themselves as adverse to a new union. Before the meeting closed some of the U. M. W. leaders took a hand in and the new union idea was disapproved of. The reverend gentlemen previously submitted a proposition to Mr. Duggan, which was based on the formation of a Canadian union which should absorb the P. W. A. and the U. M. W., and which should provide for a ten per cent. advance of wages to men who received \$2 a day or under. This was turned down by Mr. Duggan.

There was a stir in the square to-night about 10 o'clock. A large crowd of men gathered in a mass and surged up and down the street for a time. It was said that a Chinaman was being hustled. The police arrived and the crowd dispersed.

Drome Flight at Petawawa.

Petawawa, July 26.—Everything is ready at Petawawa Camp for the initial flight of Douglas McCurdy's aerodrome, "Silver Dart," which is scheduled to take place to-day. Rain interfered with the intended test on Saturday and a delay in arrangements will not permit the trials until late in the week.

It is understood that the Militia Department is keeping in close touch with Mr. Baldwin and several officials including Major Maunsell, Dominion director of engineering services, will arrive to witness the first flight.

Douglas McCurdy, the aviator, seems to be well pleased with the ground surface here which will be favorable to the "flying start" required by the Bell drome. He is enthusiastic regarding the approaching tests and is hopeful that the "Silver Dart" under his guiding hand, will perform in mid-air as never before.

Cruiser on Sand Bank.

Harwich, Eng., July 26.—The British protected cruiser Blenheim grounded on a sand bank while entering the harbor Saturday morning. The position of the warship is not serious.

The Blenheim is the cruiser that brought the body of Sir John Thompson to Canada.

G.T.P. Contract Let.

Fort McLeod, July 26.—Another contract has been awarded to Messrs. Fuley, Welch and Stewart for the building of the grade of the Grand Trunk Pacific from the McLeod River to Tete Jaune Cache, 180 miles. This will place the finished grade 50 miles west of Yellowhead Pass.

Fourth Week of Strike.

Glouce Bay, N.S., July 26.—The third week of the great strike has passed and yet public opinion is divided as to results.

Friday and Saturday shipments were reported at 10,000 tons. Out of this 5,600 tons came from the banks. A large number of men have been brought in from outside. Every department is working hard and coal is being mined and rushed to the shipping pier.

So far no strikers of any consequence have returned to work. A large part of the foreign element have gone away to railway construction.
