THE LATE EX-GOV. RUSSELL.

Remains brought to St. John last night. The remains of the late William E. Russell, ex-Governor of Massachusetts, were brought to this city Friday evening from Dalhousie in a special train. The remains were placed in a casket and were taken to the residence of Mr. Peabody, of Boston, who was on the fishing trip. At Moncton the party was met by Mr. S. A. Wetmore, of the Boston Herald, and Mr. J. N. Taylor, of the Boston Globe, who returned to St. John in the special. At the station a number of prominent citizens had gathered, among whom were U. S. Conall, Dr. Vice-Consul Jewett, Mayor Robertson, Rev. J. B. Green, J. V. Ellis, M. P., A. A. Stockton, M. P., P. Dr. Thomas Walker, John Cheley, ex-M. P., Major Markham, E. L. Jewett, E. Lantian, A. L. Calhoun, and S. D. Scott. Mr. Russell, the Dufferin, and Mr. T. Fred. Powers took charge of the remains and had the body removed to the Undertaker church, the use of which had been offered by Rev. J. B. Green. Col. Russell, Mr. Peabody, Conall, Jewett, Nov. Mr. Green, Dr. Walker and others accompanied the remains to the church. There the coffin was opened and the body was found to be perfectly preserved. The dead statesman was dressed in the clothes in which he had retired the last night of his life. The body was left in the church all night, and on application to the chief of police a permit was given to place the body in the morning in the special train. The remains were accompanied by the U. S. Conall and Rev. Mr. Green, were taken to the station and placed in the regular train for Boston.

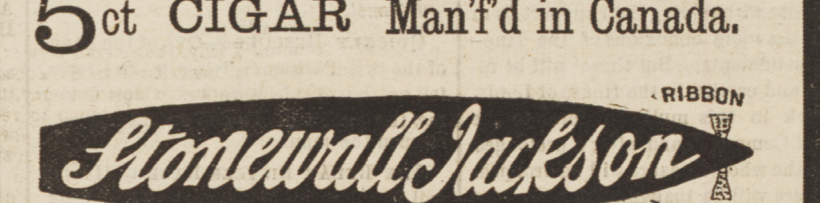

Dr. Bayard, in accepting the gift, reiterated the words of the Mayor and congratulated the ladies on having given the city the ambulance, which were greatly appreciated.

SUICIDE OF AN ALLEGED WIFE MURDERER. Authorities Were Secretly Investigating His Wife's Death—Suspected Man Heard Of It and Took His Life.

Presque Isle people were shocked to-day to learn of the suicide of a prominent citizen, and his death exposes what is supposed to have been a terrible tragedy, which has been a mystery. The suicide was Frank G. Thomas, who had a large farm and was in prosperous circumstances.

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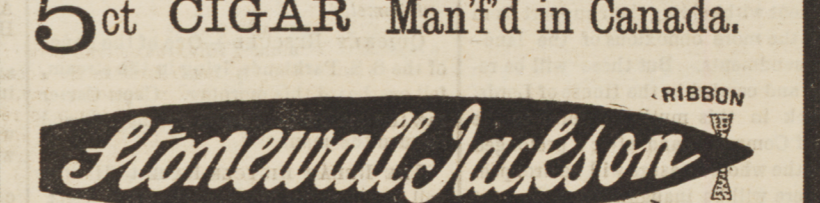
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
