MONUMENT TO ANNIE KEMPTON.—Messrs. Stanton Bros., St. John, are preparing a monument to put over Annie Kempton's grave. The first base is rough and is 5 feet 6 inches long, 3 feet 4 inches wide and 1 foot 4 inches high. The next base, slightly smaller, is of polished granite. On this rests the top.
