THE SESSION.
The early predictions of a very short session of Parliament are not likely to be realized. Supply is to be taken in the week, but little progress is likely to be made with it, for the opposition have already opened one line of attack and are preparing for an onslaught on the government in two other directions. The debate on the civil servant is to be published, and a heated discussion may take place. This seems to be an utter waste of time. The Conservatives have very little cause of complaint. No fair minded man will deny that the government has been lenient in the extreme with regard to public servants who for years have been misusing their positions and openly opposing and roundly denouncing the Liberal party. It seems also that the opposition propose to attack the government for the leasing of Governor General's warrants, although in so doing they will be condemning themselves, and, besides, there is sure to be a debate over the correspondence between Governor General and the government on the question of appointments. No doubt Sir Charles Tupper will bring the matter up by an amendment to the motion to go into supply, and as the government will be bound to support the action of the Queen's representative, an important debate is sure to take place, resulting perhaps in the first test vote. As the opposition is developing an aggressive attitude, many other sides issues are likely to come up, so that an extension of the session beyond the anticipated four or five weeks may be expected.

UNITED STATES POLITICS.
To-morrow the sound money Democratic convention will meet at Indianapolis. There will be a large attendance, for apparently the most of the country has been aroused to the importance of the situation. Senator Vilas is now considered the probable candidate for President, and it is confidently claimed will carry four Democratic states, thereby reducing to six the vote that would go to the regular Democratic candidate. This is not the only blow to be given to the Chicago convention programme, the other being that of the regular Democratic candidate of Mr. Sewall, of Maine, the regular Democratic candidate for Vice-President. Under a scheme just hatched in the west, Mr. Sewall's defeat is assured, even if Mr. Bryan is elected. A fusion programme has been arranged by the free silver Republicans and Populists in the west and south. There will be a union electoral ticket, upon which at least a part of the electors shall be Mr. Bryan and Watson, instead of Bryan and Sewall. Mr. Bryan may sweep these states by tremendous majorities, but Mr. Sewall cannot get more than the fixed proportion of electors allotted to him by the Populists, because there will be only that number of Sewall electors in the field. This will be of no real advantage to Mr. Watson, but it will ensure defeat for Mr. Sewall, who is bitterly opposed by the Populists. With all these divisions and sub-divisions the great Democratic party is in a bad way truly.

PRISON REFORM DEMANDED.
The release of the Irish prisoners from the prison at Portland, England, has attracted widespread attention throughout Great Britain, not so much because of interest in the political aspects of the account of the dreadful revelations of prison life that are a physical wreck, and nearly all are mentally deranged. One, as has been reported in some extent at least, wandered away from his relatives' home, was deranged, and has probably perished. It is urged in the Irish press that the real reason for the pardon of these men was the fear that they would die in prison, and that the consequent expense of prison life would have a bad effect politically. Little credit is therefore given the government for exercising clemency. In the discussion that is taking place on prison life, much stress is laid upon the fact, which has been proved, that the Irish prisoners were given exceptionally harsh treatment. The sentence of penal servitude is divided in the case of all prisoners into three principal stages. In the first stage, which lasts some months, the prisoners pass the whole time, except a brief period allotted to prayers and an hour a day to exercise, in a cell apart from all the other prisoners, working at some kind of labor. In the second stage, which lasts some months, the prisoners are taken to a separate cell, but work in association, under strict supervision. In the third stage he is conditionally released from prison on a ticket-of-leave. The prisoner's mind is broken upon itself. He is condemned to perpetual silence, except when asked a question by a warder. His works necessary under constant supervision, any slackening being visited with close confinement on bread and water for a spell not exceeding three days in succession. Throughout the whole period of confinement male prisoners are not allowed to speak to each other under severe penalties. It has been alleged, and it was proved to some extent at least before a Parliamentary committee, that the inmates had to sleep on plank beds covered with mattresses as hard as the stone walls. Instead of the ordinary movable stools they were only rough logs fastened to the floor by iron stanchions. That their cells were colder than those of the other prisoners and that in the evening they were thrown into their cells by means of a rickshaw, which injuriously affected their sight; that they were prevented systematically from sleeping the full allowable period by the practice adopted by warders of placing the trap doors through which they were inspected every half-hour throughout the night, and by turning the full glare of the light upon the prisoners' eyes until they were thoroughly awakened. Their meals were not served to them as in other prisons; that they got their food in a tin, and that it was unwholesome and incredible if proof were not forthcoming—the rations and the terms of a convict prison were greatly inferior to those for them by the jailers. Some of the

dynamite's allegations were not sustained by evidence, but broken to bits and exploded by the government to order their transfer to Portland prison, where they have been since then without finding any cause for special complaint.
The object lesson afforded by the appearance of these released men—prematurely old, broken to health and enfeebled in mind—will not be lost on the British public, and reforms of the barbarous prison system will surely follow. It is a somewhat remarkable fact that British prisons are considered as the most humane and best in the world, and presented to Parliament when demanded.

SPAIN IN MORE TROUBLE.
Revolt in the Philippines is a Serious Character.
MADRID, Sept. 1.
The government has received a cable despatch from the Governor General of the Philippines announcing a serious uprising and asking for reinforcements. In the course of an interview with the Governor General, it is stated that the fact that the insurrectionary movement in the Philippines is serious. I am confident that the rebels will be crushed, even should the movement last till the arrival of the reinforcements which are on the point of starting. This deplorable outbreak cannot then fall to be extinguished. I cannot deny that circumstances are serious. Spain has found herself in a like situation since the war of independence. The government needs the assistance of all and the united effort, effective support of all political parties, without any sort of juggling. It relies on the patriotism of all, feeling sure that in such an ominous condition it will not be disappointed."
