The Brig *Henry Tate*, Doyle, from Belfast, struck on a snag
the 14th June, and sunk, a short distance below N. Orleans.
HALIFAX, August 4.
Shipwreck.—The American ship *Franklin*, of Portsmouth
New-Hampshire, Captain Harding, from Liverpool, for
Portsmouth, was wrecked on the rocks and crabs, about 42 days,
was stranded on the N. E. bar of Sable Island, in a thick
fog, on Monday last, 23rd ult. with ship and cargo totally lost;
crew all saved and landed on the island, in the long boat
and a small boat, about 7 o'clock evening, in the *Stiehr*
Packet, Captain Darby. The *Franklin* went ashore about
twelve miles from the island.
Port of Liverpool, N. S. July 8.—Arrived, arch. David
Higgins, J. Sanderson master, from Halifax, to 24 tons, with
a cargo of fish, from the *John*, master, from the same place,
previous by a large schooner, about three hundred tons burthen,
from New-Brunswick, bound to Quebec; they could not
ascertain the name of the vessel or master, and was not offered
for sale by the agent. The schooner fortunately
received no other injury.
PICTOU, July 30.—The Brig *St. Elizabeth*, of South
Shields, bound from Bay Chaleur, to Liverpool, Eng., was
stranded off the Magdalen Islands; rigging and masts were
lost, and the vessel was abandoned, and the cargo was
lost.
The ship *Richard Sands*, Owen, bound from Quebec, to
Liverpool, with timber, went on shore at Bryant Island.
The captain and crew arrived here yesterday morning, with
part of the rigging, materials, &c.
