RECEIVED ACT, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of his late Majesty, shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be in full force, excepting so far as the same is herein expressly altered; and that this Act, and also the said last mentioned Act, (except as aforesaid,) shall extend, and be construed to extend, to the City of Saint John, any law usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

VI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That each and every person who shall be appointed Inspector of Fish within the City of St. John, shall give bond to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of Saint John, with two sufficient sureties for the due discharge of his duty, in such sum as they may deem proper, not less than fifty pounds, and not exceeding one hundred pounds; and that the Bonds to be given by Inspectors of Fish in any other part of the Province, shall be made and entered into in the name of His Majesty, his heirs and successors.

VII. And be it further enacted, That if any Inspector of Fish shall brand any barrel, half-barrel, tierce, or hoghead, without having examined the same, or which shall not be of proper size, description, and quality; he shall forfeit and pay for each and every offence, the sum of five pounds, to be sued for and recovered with costs before any two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County where such offence shall be committed; and to be levied by distress and sale of the offenders Goods and Chattels; which penalty, when recovered, shall be paid as follows: one half to the person who shall inform and sue for the same, and the other half to the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish where such offence shall be committed; and if no Goods or Chattels shall be found whereon to levy such penalty, the offender shall be committed to the Gaol of the County where such offence shall be committed, by warrant of the said Justices, for a space of time not less than ten days and not exceeding twenty days, as such Justices in their discretion may deem proper.

VIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained, shall extend, or be construed, to prevent the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of Saint John, from making such further and other regulation for the inspection of Fish, put up in the said city for exportation, or brought into the said City for that purpose, as they from time to time may consider necessary; not contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.
