

The Marquis of Anglesey.—The attention of Parliament has lately been drawn to the subject of this Noble Lord's having been removed from the Lieutenant Governorship of Ireland.—His Lordship felt aggrieved no doubt at his dismissal, and therefore determined to lay his case before the Country.

On the fourth of May he brought forward the subject in the House of Lords, which gave rise to a spirited discussion, and to the reading of a long correspondence which had taken place between the Duke of Wellington, Mr. Peel, and his Lordship, which our limits will not admit of our inserting.—From Mr. Peel's side, the misunderstanding between his Lordship and the Prime Minister arose in the following way.—The Marquis wrote a private letter to Dr. Curtis, relative to some matters connected with the Catholic Association, telling him also that no time was to be lost in pushing forward the subject of Catholic Emancipation.

After he had sent the letter, which he said was never intended to become a public document, he at the solicitation of some friends, who were anxious to know what was the result, allowed them to call on Dr. Curtis for a perusal of the letter, and also to publish the same should they think such a step advisable.—This letter was published, and the next day the Duke of Wellington received from Government, a notice of removal from his office as Lord Lieutenant of Ireland.

The result of the Noble Marquis' representation of the case will be gathered from the following article, which we copy from the London Courier of the 6th.

The Marquis of Anglesey brought forward his motion yesterday, relative to his recall. Now, after an attentive consideration of his Lordship's speech, and the documents which he read, and of the Duke of Wellington's reply, we retain the opinion we took the liberty of expressing yesterday, that it was a subject which did not call for Parliamentary investigation.

Parliament could not pronounce any opinion upon the subject. It could not interpose without trenching upon the King's Prerogative.

"Any interference," we said yesterday, "with the King's Prerogative of appointing his Representatives ought to be avoided, unless in extreme and urgent cases. There are many instances to Governors of Settlements, to Ambassadors, &c. which cannot be disclosed without inconvenience."

"An Ambassador, or the Governor of a distant Settlement, may feel some displeasure at being removed from his situation, and may conceive that he ought not to have been recalled, but this is not a subject for Legislative interference, unless where the interests of the country are manifestly sacrificed or injured by such a recall."

"Nearly the same opinion was expressed by the Duke of Wellington. 'It must be obvious,' said his Grace, 'to your Lordships, that Parliament has no business to interfere with regard to the dismissal of any of his Majesty's Servants from the Government of the country, except some material public injury has been thereby occasioned, or some considerable inconvenience has been felt in consequence of the proceeding, or except in cases where a Parliament has found it necessary to interfere to obtain a change of Government. In such cases Parliament has interfered: but otherwise not. And I maintain this to be a wholesome and necessary rule, for, in other cases than such as I have mentioned, Parliament never can interfere without great public injury and inconvenience.'"

"The Noble Marquis moved for the production of two papers. Suppose the motion had been agreed to, what further proceeding could have been founded upon it?—Parliament could not have come to any vote, either in approbation or in condemnation of his Lordship's recall. The Motion was negatived."

rate, the West India planter with such articles of United States produce as could only reach him either by restimant at foreign ports, or at the British North American Free Ports.

It will be borne in mind that our Colonial Vessels are now excluded from the Ports of the United States altogether, so that every article from thence must be brought in United States Bottoms, whether it be for the consumption of the Province or for exportation.—The tonnage duty now levied, therefore, must operate as a direct tax either upon the exporter, directly, (and of course indirectly on the West India Merchant,) or else upon the inhabitants of the Province, so far as the United States productions are concerned here, for it is obvious that the rate of freight must be increased in a ratio with the rate of tonnage, and consequently, that the price of the articles imported must suffer a corresponding enhancement.

So far as regards the consequent increase in the value of United States articles imported for consumption here, we are not disposed to view the matter as a very serious evil; as the excess is finally applied for the promotion of Provincial improvements, and operates only as a general taxation; but, as it places the Free Ports in a position of competition, regarding the supplying of the British West India Islands, with Foreign Ports, we do think it detrimental to British trade and shipping.

Our own opinion is, that there still remains a disposition on the part both of Great Britain and the United States to have the Colonial Trade regulated upon some permanent principle; and that contrivances to effect this are likely to be made soon.

Just as our paper was going to Press, we were handed by a friend, the Liverpool Times of the 12th, and the London Morning Herald, of the 9th, received by the Waterloo, from Liverpool—from which we extract the following articles:—

The troubles in the manufacturing districts, appear to be subsiding, and a slight indication of an increase in the demand for Goods, is visible.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer brought forward the Budget in the House of Commons on the 8th, by which it appears that there is a clear surplus of income over the expenditure, of three millions, sterling, to be applied towards the reduction of the national debt.

Lord Colchester, (Mr. Abbot, late Speaker of the House of Commons,) died in London on the 8th ult. in the 74th year of his age.

The Deputies from Liverpool, Manchester, Glasgow, Bristol, and Birmingham, have had a meeting with the Duke of Wellington, Lord Ellenborough, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, and the President of the Board of Trade on the subject of a free Trade with India and China.—An interesting discussion, regarding the matter in the House of Commons is looked for.—The E. I. Company's Charter, does not expire until 1834—not in 1832 as was generally imagined.

The June Circuit Court will commence its sitting on Tuesday next, when a Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Delivery will also be held.—We understand His Honor Judge Borsford will preside.
