LITERATURE.

NOTES ON AMERICA AND CANADA. (From the Montreal Gazette.) Continued from our last.

ALBANY.—Canals—Legislature—Public Education—Militia Training—Troy.—Classical Appellation—Shaker's Village.

Albany is the seat of Government of the State of New-York, and is a well-situated and well-built town. In the neighbourhood are many Dutch families, descendants of very old settlers; even in the town are some remains of Dutch buildings, gables built to the street. The principal street is very wide, and too steep to be comfortable, but its elevation makes the upper part very pleasant; at the top of it in the centre is the Capitol, where meet the Assembly, the Senate, the Supreme Court, and the County Court.—The State Library in it almost provokes a laugh; but perhaps what I saw was only a very small portion of it. There are about 20,000 inhabitants. We are now losing sight of the black population; they form a very insignificant portion of the inhabitants here. This place is the grand resting place, in transitu, between New-York and Canada, as well as between New-York and the Western States, by reason of the two Canals, the Champlain and the Erie. The trade of this city has varied much; it is the place of an immense transit. Between the 20th April and the 1st September about 6,000 canal boats entered inwards, and as many proceeded outwards. No buildings here struck me, as worthy of remark; the Museum was trumpery in the extreme.

The Champlain and Erie Canals, unite about eight miles and a half from hence, and terminate here in a large basin 4,000 feet long. The pier between the basin and the river is built of timber and water, timber secured by a very long pier. The former Canal runs to Whitehall, where it joins Lake Champlain, and thence into the Saint Lawrence, by the St. John's Falls, or Richouen River, and is the direct communication between New-York and Canada; it is 63 miles in length. The toll receipts in 1827 were 72,833 dollars, or £16,387. The Erie, is the most interesting work at present in America, and is the parent of all the projected canal operations now going on. The State of New-York owes this to the late Dewitt Clinton, whose family, in shame he it spoken, has been left in an almost destitute state.—Almost as many claims have been made to the original project of this great work as to the steam engine; it is probable that many "long-headed" men may have "guessed" at the bare possibility of such an undertaking, and it does appear that so long back as 1792 and 1796, some such thoughts were brooded, but as the back country was at that time a wilderness, the present extent could never have been contemplated. But it remained for Clinton to carry it into effect. Through all the murmurs, the envy, and the ridicule of the multitude, Clinton's "big-ditch," as it is called, has, however, been a source of immense wealth to the State; his industry in commencing the Canal in the centre of his line is remarkable; He first completed 69 miles of the "Long Level" from Salina to Frankfort, for which astonishing distance no lock was required; besides which, he at once raised up a dam of 1792 and 1796, some such thoughts were brooded, but as the back country was at that time a wilderness, the present extent could never have been contemplated. But it remained for Clinton to carry it into effect. 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
