The European intelligence, received since our last publication, is down to the 3d of February, via the United States. Our readers will find, in another column, extracts from the files which came to hand, by the last Western Mail.

From the New-York Mercantile Advertiser. ROWLAND STEPHENSON.—We mentioned yesterday the arrival of this man in a pilot boat, from Savannah. It appears that the persons who took possession of his person and conveyed him thither, acted without any authority probably with the view of obtaining the 1500 dollars reward, said to have been offered for his apprehension in a hand-bill.

It is proper to state, that in these measures, no person here can be implicated. The gentlemen in this city, who were employed by the Recorder of St. John, to be despatched two messengers to Savannah, but the first did not leave here till Thursday, and the other sailed on Sunday last.

At the instance of some of the countrymen of Stephenson, a writ of habeas corpus was procured, and a demand made for the person of Stephenson. We annex the proceedings under this writ, as they are stated in the American.

At 1 P.M. Mr. Stephenson was brought into the Recorder's room by Mr. Hays, and after a short consultation with two or three gentlemen who appeared to act as counsel for him, the Recorder stated that there appeared to be no legal process by which he was detained, and inquired if there was any reason why he should not be discharged from the custody of Mr. Hays.

The Dey of Algiers has sent a Charge d'Affaires to Tunis, to settle the basis of a treaty of peace and commerce with the French Consul at that capital. The Quotidienne expresses a disbelief of any satisfactory arrangement for the present.

The London Times speaks of great depression among English ship owners. The freights from Calcutta to England in August were—Dead weight £2 10s per ton; light freight, £1 to £3 ditto. From Bombay, in July, £1 10s only per ton; and from Singapore, £3 10s to £5 10s.

Burke, the Edinburgh murderer, was executed at Edinburgh on the 26th January. A crowd of people amounting to about 35,000, witnessed the tragedy—their hisses and groans continued without intermission during the execution, marking, in strong colors, the detestation of the populace against the inhuman wretch.

At a very numerous and respectable meeting of the Inhabitants of the City and County of Saint John, held pursuant to public advertisement, in the City-Hall yesterday, for the purpose of taking into consideration the measures proper to be adopted, to effect the erection of a Bridge over the River Saint John, in the vicinity of the City:

The Pilot Boat Savannah, after proceeding down the Bay to Penikese Hook, was on Monday the 28th inst. boarded and taken possession of by a Deputy Sheriff. Three men are on board—Capt. White, who came as Commander, and three others who were particularly sought for, are not to be found. It may be presumed that the boat name to anchor for the purpose of receiving them.

Rowland Stephenson again.—The Savannah papers of the 14th inst. apprise us, that the Governor of Georgia had been petitioned to demand from the Governor of New-York, "the person of Rowland Stephenson, he having been kidnapped, when owing temporary allegiance to the Government of Georgia, and protected by its laws."

ANTIGUA.—Taxation.—In an Act passed in the latter part of January, for raising a sum of money in aid of the Public Treasury of the Island we find materials (says the New-York Atlas) for the following exhibition of the ratio of taxation and specification of the objects of Assessment.

On every 1500 lbs. net of Sugar shipped during the year, 5 shillings; on every 100 gals. of Rum, do. 4s; on every 100 gals. Molasses, do. 3s. 6d; on all Lands not cultivated as Sugar estates, or in the occupation of Sugar Planters affected by the preceding provisions of the Act, 2s 6d per acre; on all additional provisions 10s, over and above the 3s laid by another Act; on every four wheeled carriage 72s; on every two wheeled carriage 36s; on all Dwelling-Houses, Tenements, and other buildings not attached to any Stores, Warehouses, Shops, Wharves, or Cellars used as Shops or Warehouses, 24 per centum; on all Stores, Warehouses, Shops, or Cellars used as Shops, being actually in use or occupation for any business, 26 for every Hundred Pounds of annual rent or value of the same, and so in proportion to any lesser sum; and all Dwelling Houses attached to any Stores, Warehouses, Shops, Wharves or Cellars, are to be considered part thereof, and assessed accordingly to the last mentioned rate and proportion.
