### LATEST FROM EUROPE.

(RECEIVED BY THE DECEMBER MAIL.)  
**LONDON, NOVEMBER 18.**

**SIERRA LEONE**.—Death of Governor Lumley  
—another victim—another Governor, and several  
of his suite, have perished in that infamous swamp  
of pestilence and iniquity. We have before us a  
letter, dated Sierra Leone, August 19: Lieut-  
enant-Governor Lumley is dead; so is Esing  
Gordon of his staff, and the Governor's white ser-  
vant is not expected to recover! The Governor  
and his whole staff were struck down by the pes-  
tilence on the fall swoop. Brigade Major Frazer  
and Lieutenant M'Lean were recovered. A rela-  
tion of the late Granville Sharp had come out  
by post-master. Horror-struck at what he saw,  
and trembling for his life, he, in two days after landing  
insisted on being sent back to England. Doctor  
Clark and Doctor Foulis are both laid up. The  
mortality even amongst the black inhabitants, says  
the letter, is 'frightful!' The burial-grounds are  
evening and morning filled with victims! Need  
we add more! We have not revealed all the hor-  
rors, but amidst death, we cannot dwell on in-  
iquity.—*Glasgow Courier.*  
*Gibraltar.*—Gibraltar Chronicles to the 24th  
of October, have been received, being the same  
date as the advices by the French papers, a day  
or two since. They do not confirm the melanc-  
choly details in these papers, of the increase of the  
fever in the last three days; but, on the contrary,  
the official details show a sensible diminution of  
the mortality, and the disorder seems to be on the  
decline. October 21.—Remain ill 217; admitted, 118;  
dead, 15; under observation in camp, 40; Officers  
sick, 18.  
October 22.—Remain ill, 939; admitted, 84;  
dead, 12; under observation in camp, 30; Officers  
sick, 18.  
October 23.—Remain ill, 944; admitted 90;  
dead, 19; under observation in camp, 25; Officers  
sick, 19.  
On the 23d and 24th, four medical practitioners  
were still ill.  
The number of Deaths being not half those stated  
in the communication via France, or the remain-  
ing sick more than two thirds.  
The Deputy Governor of the Civil Hospital had  
invited the inhabitants to send to the aid of the  
poorer classes all useless liens, &c. for their ur-  
gent wants, and also required supplies of water  
from the private tanks. On the 22d the Deputy-  
Governor notices having received a communication  
from His Excellency Don Lopez Ballasteros,  
one of His Catholic Majesty's principal Secretaries  
of State, announcing, on the part of His Ma-  
jesty, his directions to send 10,000 Fanegas of  
Wheat (one-fifth of an English quarter each Fan-  
ega) to grind into flour for the use of the poorer  
classes in the garrison. General Don states that  
in its most efficient manner in conformity with  
the beneficent wishes of the King of Spain. On  
the 21st wind E. cloudy; 22d ditto, breezes attend-  
ed with showers.  
The Court Newsmen has for some time abstained  
from noticing the Young Queen of Portugal.  
Her Royal Highness has suddenly sunk into re-  
tirement; but why or wherefore no one can tell.  
Mr. Huskisson arrived in town on Monday from  
Paris.

**BRUNSWICK CLUBS**.—As we have no motive,  
whenever may be our own sentiments on a particu-  
lar question, for concealing the truth from our  
readers, we lay before them the following, on the  
accuracy of which, full reliance may be placed.—  
The Duke of Wellington has expressed himself ad-  
versely, his directions to send 10,000 Fanegas of  
Wheat, regarding them as an attempt to rule the  
country by means of associations. In Ireland, on  
the contrary, His Grace is well pleased to see  
them formed, for this reason—that although clubs  
are in themselves an evil, yet being already in ex-  
istence on the one side, it is necessary to neutral-  
ise their dangerous tendency by counter associa-  
tions. But in England where no clubs previously  
existed, the Noble Duke considers their introduc-  
tion to be deprecated, as calculated to inflame the  
minds of the people. Such is the plain statement  
of facts, which, knowing it to be correct, we  
should not, we repeat, consider ourselves justified  
whatever may be our own sentiments with regard  
to the great question at issue, in withholding from  
our readers.—*Brighton Gazette.*  
*The New Judge of the Court of King's Bench.*  
—J. Parke, Esq. who is appointed to succeed Mr.  
Justice Holroyd, will be sworn into office this day  
(Tuesday) before the Lord Chancellor. The  
learned Gentleman will take his seat in Court  
to-morrow, to decide upon a writ of right brought  
by the law officers of the Crown to recover some  
valuable property in Cornwall.  
A Sunday paper calls Mr. Parke, the new Judge,  
in the room of Mr. Justice Holroyd, who has re-  
signed, the son of the Judge of the Common Pleas.  
This is a mistake; there is no relationship, in any  
degree, between the two Judges.  
Some extensive failures have lately taken place  
at Glasgow amongst the manufacturers, and com-  
mission agents—East India speculations are the  
cause of this disaster. The markets in India have  
been overstocked with piece goods and cotton  
yarn, and immense losses have been sustained in  
consequence—thirteen firms have already stopped  
payment.  
Letters received from the Mediterranean, com-  
municate the loss of His Majesty's sloop Jas-  
per, 10. Com. L. G. Roche, which was wrecked  
on the north end of the Island of Santa Maria, in  
the night of the 15th October. The officers and  
crew, and part of their stores were saved, but the  
vessel is a total wreck.  
*Dreadful Explosion of Gas at Covent Garden  
Theatre.*—On Tuesday, at two o'clock, a  
most shocking explosion of Gas occurred at Co-  
vent-Garden Theatre. It appears that the work-  
men were employed in taking down the pipes, and  
the gasometer when incautiously going too near  
with a lighted candle, a most tremendous explo-  
sion took place. Five of the workmen were  
killed nearly dead, and carried to the Middlesex  
Hospital; two persons are missing and are sup-  
posed to have been killed.

**NOVEMBER 19.**

not confirm the capture of Silistria, though the  
siege of that fortress was pressed with an activity  
which proved that the Russians were resolved to  
obtain possession of it, before retiring into winter
