PROVINCIAL AUDITOR'S OFFICE,

Saint John, 20th August, 1830.

ALL persons who have received and who may

not have accounted for the expenditure of any

Public Monies entrusted to their care and expendi-

ture prior to the year 1828, are hereby notified

and required to make up and transmit their sev-

eral Accounts (post paid) to this Office, duly attested,

and supported by proper Vouchers, on or be-

fore the first day of October next, (all necessary

information having been already communicated of-

ficially to the several Debtors,) or they will not

be included in the Auditor's Report to be trans-

mitted to the next House of Assembly.

Supervisors of Great Roads, and Commis-

sioners of Bye Roads and Bridges, are requested

to transmit to the Auditor's Office, as above, their

several Accounts of expenditure made for all

monies received by them from the Treasurer of the

Province, since the above period,—on or before

the first day of December next; in order that they

may be audited and reported upon to the proper

Authorities, in due time.

The following extract from an Act passed at the

last Session of the General Assembly, is addressed

to the several persons whom it concerns:—

And be it further enacted, That the said sev-

eral and respective sums of money and every part

thereof shall be paid to the several and respective

persons who shall actually work and labour in

making, completing and repairing the said several

roads and bridges, or in furnishing materials there-

for, at the most reasonable rates that such labour

and materials can be provided; and the several

and respective persons who shall be entrusted with

the expenditure of the said several and respective

sums, shall keep an exact account of the expendi-

ture thereof; and shall produce receipts in writ-

ing from the several and respective persons to

whom any part of the said money shall be paid, as

vouchers for such payments; and render an ac-

count thereof upon Oath, (which oath any Justice

of the Peace in the several and respective Coun-

ties is hereby authorized to administer,) to be trans-

mitted to the Auditor, to be examined and report-

ed on by him to the General Assembly, at their next

Session:—and such Commissioners or persons en-

trusted with the expenditure of the several and re-

spective sums of money, shall stand charged and

chargeable with all sums entrusted to them and

not accounted for as aforesaid, and shall repay

the same into the Provincial Treasury.
