TRIAL OF JOHN FRANCIS KNAPP.—This case, which has excited universal and absorbing interest, is yet before the Supreme Court at Salem, The Jury, to whom the case was committed on Thursday last, after twenty-four hours deliberation, could not agree upon a verdict, and were on Friday discharged by the Court.—They submitted apparently with the utmost cheerfulness to the necessity of their confinement—*ten* entire days and nights have elapsed since they were empanelled, during all of which time they have been kept together, either in Court, or out of Court under charge of two officers, so that no person has been suffered to speak to them. At morning and evening they have occasionally taken the air, attended by the officers. The counsel for the government immediately moved for the empanelling of a new jury to proceed again with the trial. To this the prisoner's counsel objected, and moved for a postponement to the next stated term of the Court, which will be held in November. The alleged cause for this motion was the absence of S. H. Knapp, a brother of the prisoner, and who, it was believed, could give impor-
