ALL persons who have received and who may
not have accounted for the expenditure of any
Public Monies entrusted to their care and expendi-
ture prior to the year 1823, are hereby notified

roads and bridges, or in furnishing materials there-
for, at the most reasonable rates that such labour
and materials can be procured; and the several
and respective persons who shall be entrusted with
the expenditure of the said several and respective
sums, shall keep an exact account of the expendi-
ture thereof; and shall produce receipts in writ-
ting from the several and respective persons to
whom any part of the said money shall be paid, as
vouchers for such payments; and render an account
thereof upon Oath, (which oath may be sworn to
of this Peace in the several and respective Coun-
ties heretofore authorized to administer,) to be re-
turned to the Auditor, to be examined and report-
ed on by him to the General Assembly, at their next
Session; and such Commissioners or persons en-
trusted with the expenditure of the several and re-
spective sums of money, shall stand charged and
chargeable with all sums entrusted to them and
not accounted for as aforesaid, and shall repay the
same into the Province Treasury.
