RECENT MARTINIQUE.—The Charleston Southern Railroad, which is the only line of communication between the French city of Reunion, and the previous accounts of the number of lives lost in consequence of the earthquake, were exaggerated. The number of persons killed or injured did not exceed 250. The Governor of the Colony issued a proclamation authorizing the free importation of provisions, and the free export of vessels of every kind, and further orders; provided the cargo is composed to the amount of three-fourths at least of the following articles, viz. flour, salt beef, building timber, iron and nails.

CESSION OF YUCATAN TO ENGLAND.—A report is said to have reached New Orleans, by the way of Tampico, that negotiations were going on in the city of Mexico, for the cession of Yucatan to Great Britain, in payment of the debt due from Mexico.

Santa Anna is again President of Mexico.—The French ship *Barbadois*, No. 3, from Vera Cruz, which sailed 27th February, brings the above news. It was received at the port of her departure on the evening of the 26th by express, consequently the effect of the news is not yet known.
