ARRIVAL OF THE FIRST ROYAL MAIL STEAM SHIP.—The Britannia, the first of the Royal Mail Steam Ships, sailed at half-past two o'clock yesterday morning, for Liverpool, having left on the afternoon of Saturday the 4th.—She brought on board six passengers, some of whom called on the morning of the 11th, and spoke in the highest terms of praise of the Britannia; indeed, we are informed, they are confident that, in favorable weather, the passage can be made in about nine days.

NOTICE TO EMIGRANTS.—On arrival at this Port, Emigrants will observe that there is a Government Agent resident here, who will visit the vessels on board of which they arrive, as soon as they are reported by the Medical Officer, and will be employed by him in procuring lands or employment in various capacities.

At the Emigrants' attendance is given daily, where plans of Crown Lands and Private Farms are kept for the inspection and information of Emigrants, who may be desirous of becoming settlers or purchasers, and directions to those for Farm or Household work.

Emigrants should on no account remain in town, or in the streets, or in the River St. John, they are very great; nor will it be expedient for any British money, in gold or silver, to exchange it will truly make acquainted with its full current value.

Steam-boats sail every morning at seven o'clock from Indian-Town for Fredericton, where they arrive in the course of the day, and will land passengers at the River St. John, where they may desire.—They also ply by night. Convoys are also found in the flourishing agriculture of the adjacent country in the Counties of York and Carleton.
