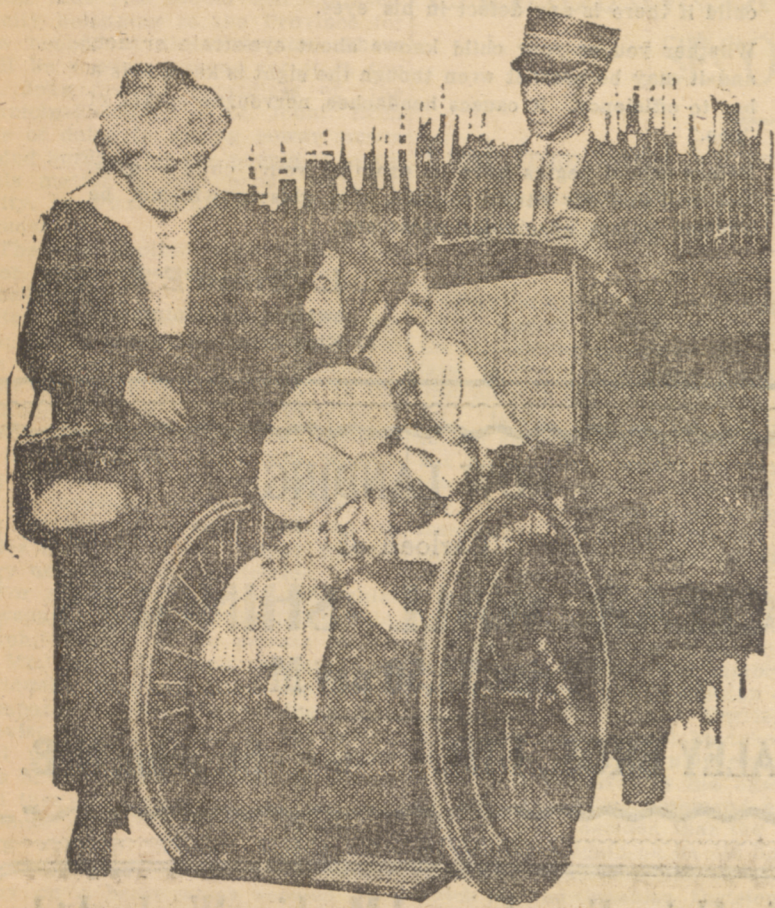


INTREPID AIRMAN'S WIFE

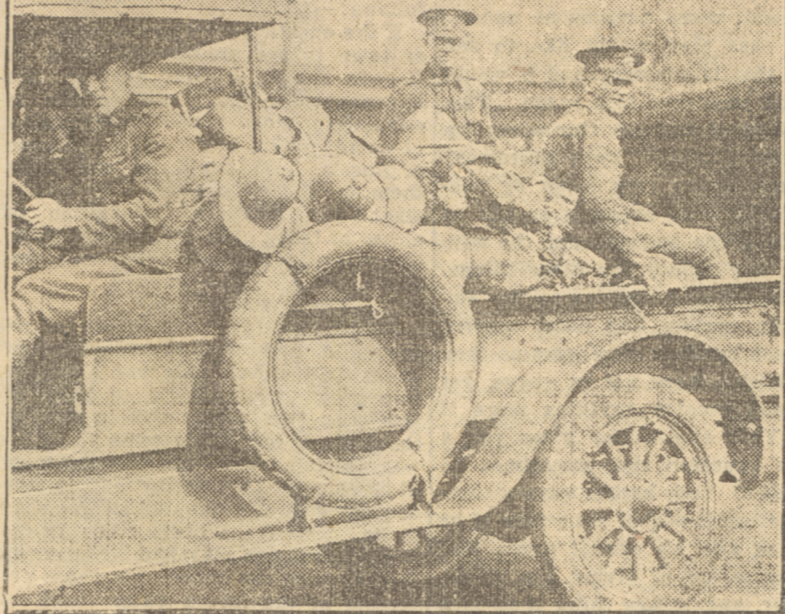

Stowaways being lowered in boat. They are to go before the City Magistrate to explain their uninvited presence aboard an ocean liner.

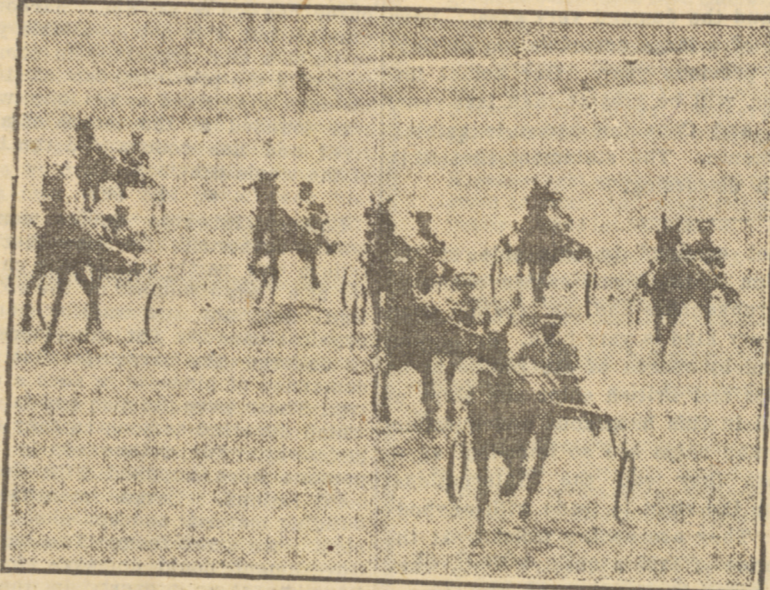
The "Beer Mayor"

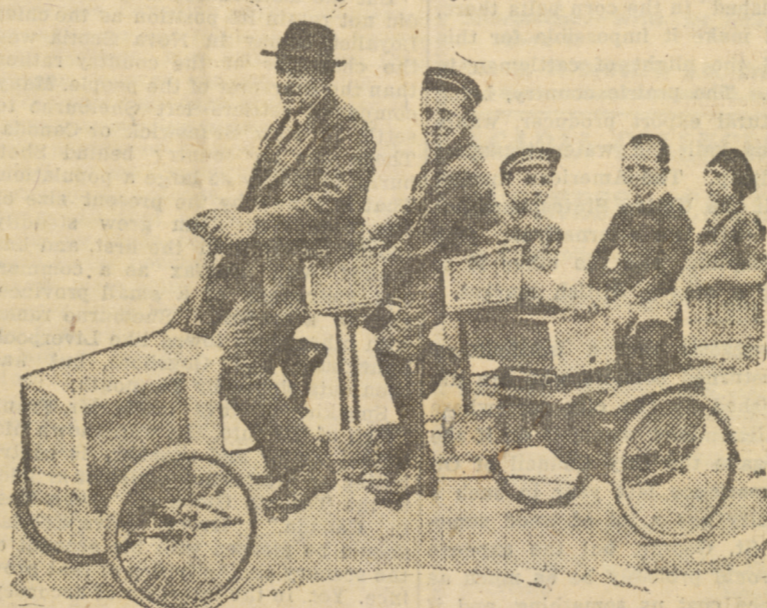
Cause for Smiling

A Family Bicycle



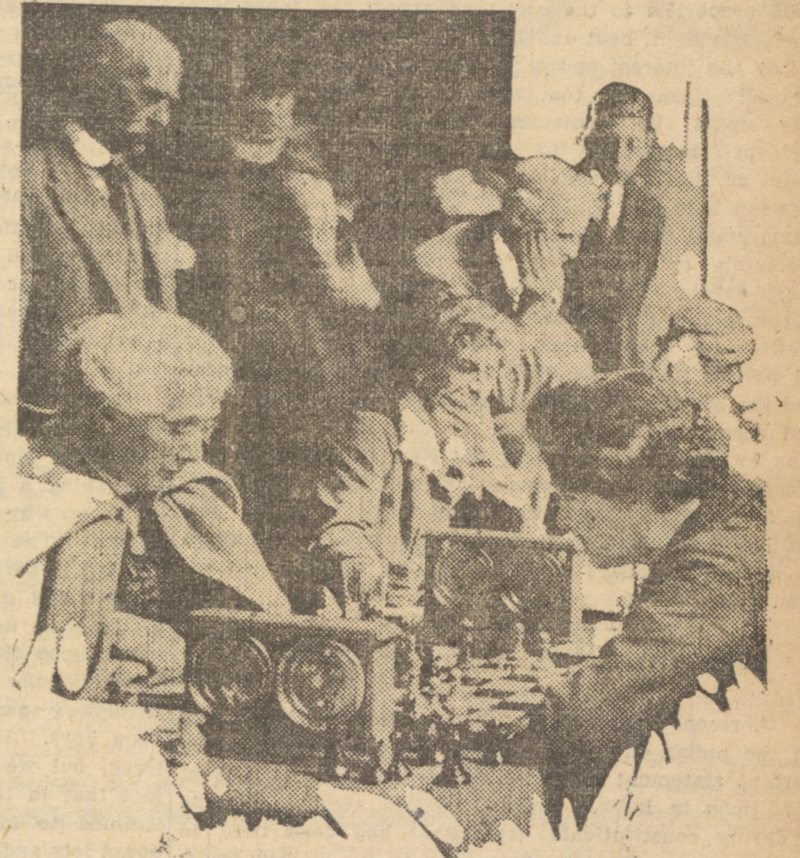

She Finds Son After 58 Years



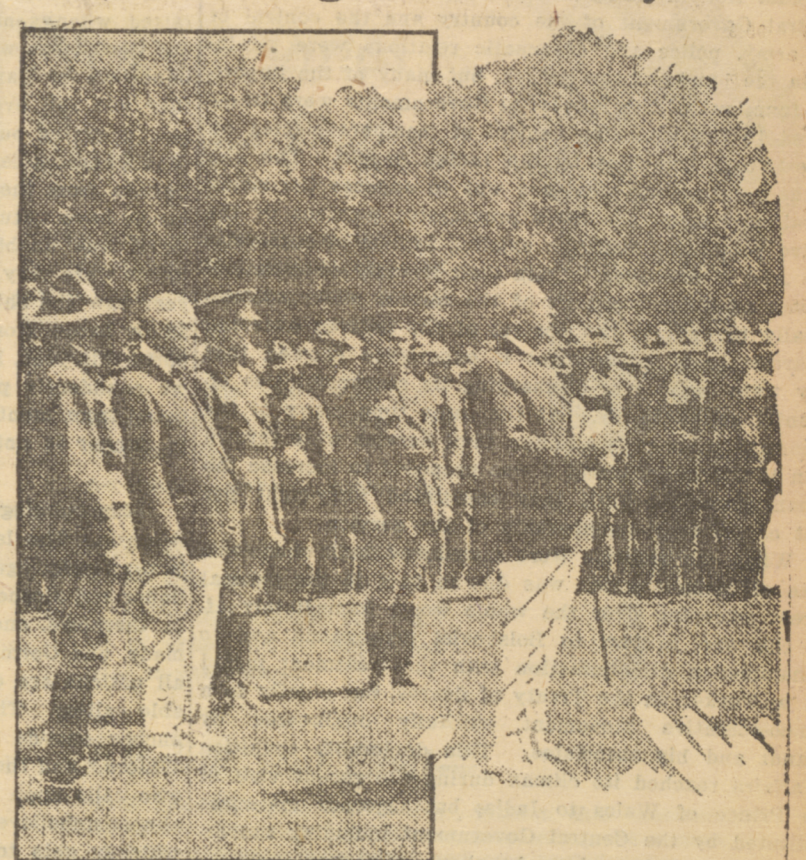
