The medley will include "Love's Old Sweet Song," sung by Katherine Carrington, soprano; "My Faithful Stradivari," as a solo by Milton Watson, tenor, and "Hazaza," by Nat Shilkret and his orchestra and chorus.

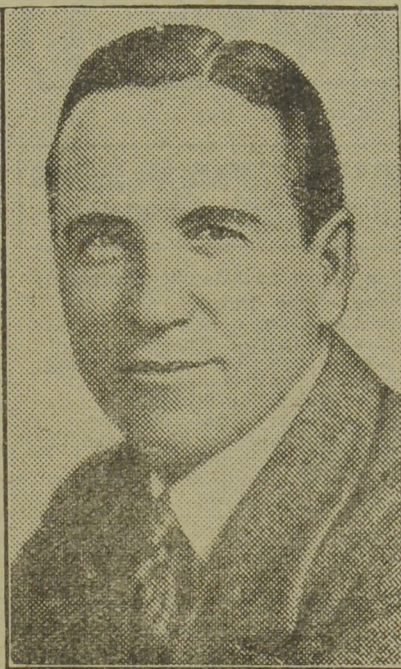
