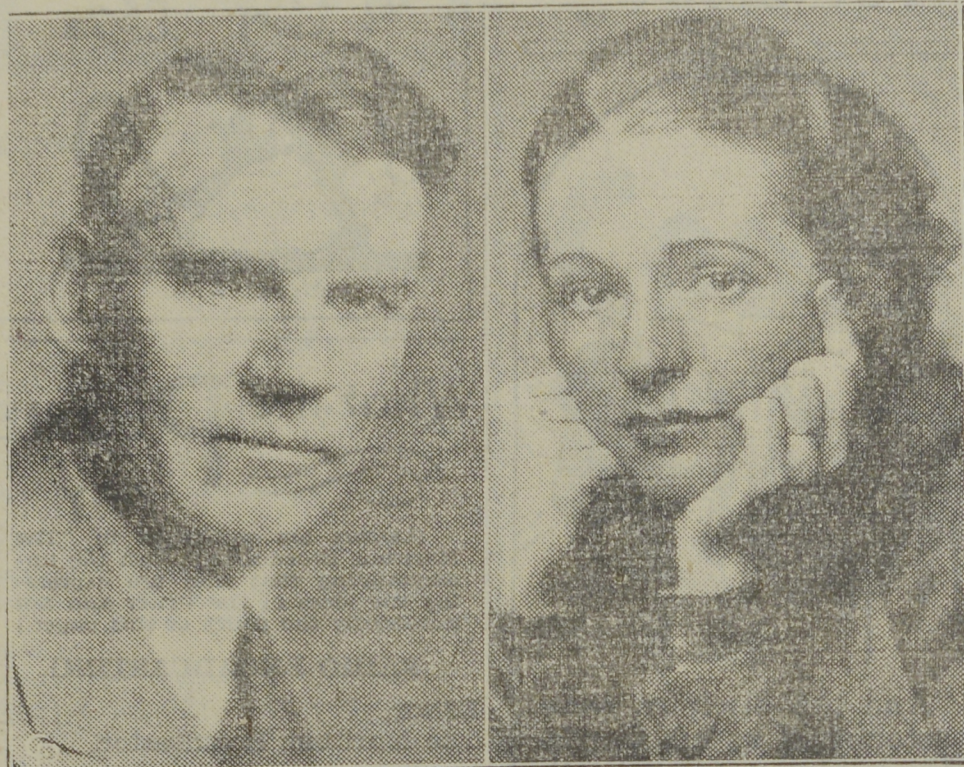
Premier Tilley Speaks Before
