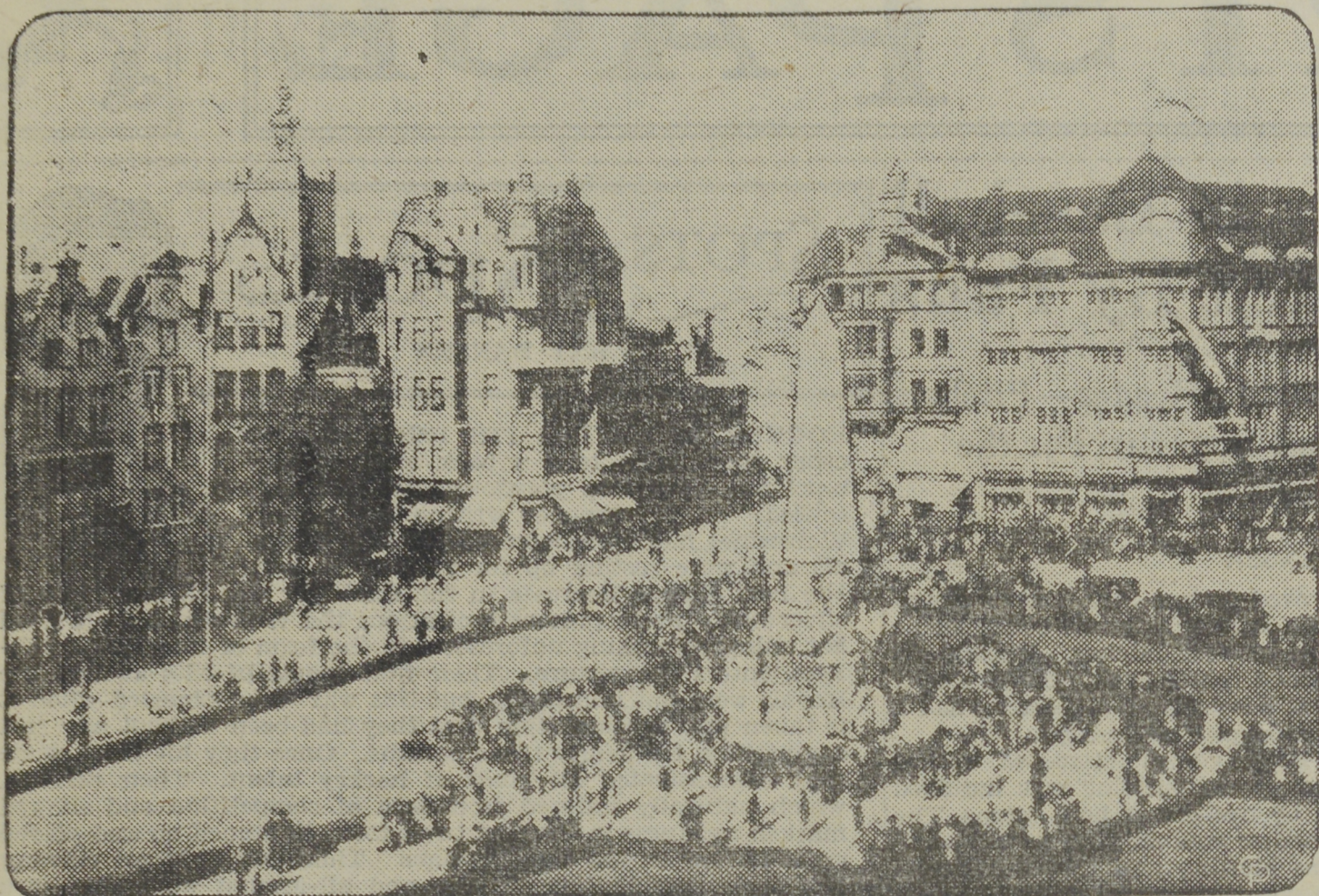


NAZI MAJORITY FALLS SHORT IN DANZIG ELECTIONS



The free city of Danzig remained free in a political as well as a geographical sense as the final election returns left the Nazis seven per cent, short of the majority sought to change the constitution and abolish

opposition parties. Reichsfuehrer Adolf Hitler's move to return Danzig to the Reich is set back. The city was made free under the Treaty of Versailles and has been a bone of contention ever since.

The News On Review

Medals to commemorate the King's Jubilee have been received from the Royal Mint in London. It was announced by Finance Minister E. N. Rhodes. They will be sold by the Canadian Mint through Canadian retail stores.

The Ontario Government's bill to invalidate hydro contracts with four Quebec power companies passed third reading in the legislature last week by a vote of 57-14. The measure becomes law on a date to be set by the Lieutenant-Governor in his proclamation.

Arthur Eustace Morgan, M.A., principal of University College, Hull, England, has been appointed principal and vice-chancellor of McGill University to succeed the late General Sir Arthur Currie, it was announced by E. W. Beatty, K.C., chancellor of the institution.

An artificial fever cure for tuberculosis, which has succeeded on 50 per cent. of the monkeys and other animals given the new treatment, was described at the meeting of the Federation of

American Societies of Experimental Biology held at Detroit recently.

South Wales coal mine owners have announced they will donate \$250,000 as the nucleus of a Royal Jubilee Fund to provide pensions for miners of the South Wales Federation, and the Miners Federation of Great Britain added \$100,000. They expressed the hope that the state would make a substantial contribution as well.

A recommendation that corporations which operate more than one unit should be made to pay income tax on each unit rather than on the consolidated results of the whole was contained in a memorandum appended to the report of the royal commission on mass buying by Hon. H. H. Stevens, one of the commissioners. Mr. Stevens protested against the practice permitting such corporations using the earnings derived from profitable units to offset losses of unprofitable ventures before being assessed for income tax.

The Baltimore and Ohio railway offices at Baltimore, Md., announced last week 23 children had been killed in a school bus-train crash at Rockville, Md. One hospital at Washington reported it had received five injured, of which two were expected to die. Police said only nine of the 28 pupils in the bus were known to have escaped injury. The pupils, whose age ranged down from 18 years, were accompanied by the principal of the Williamsport, Md., high school, which they attended. They were returning from a chemistry exhibition at the University of Maryland.

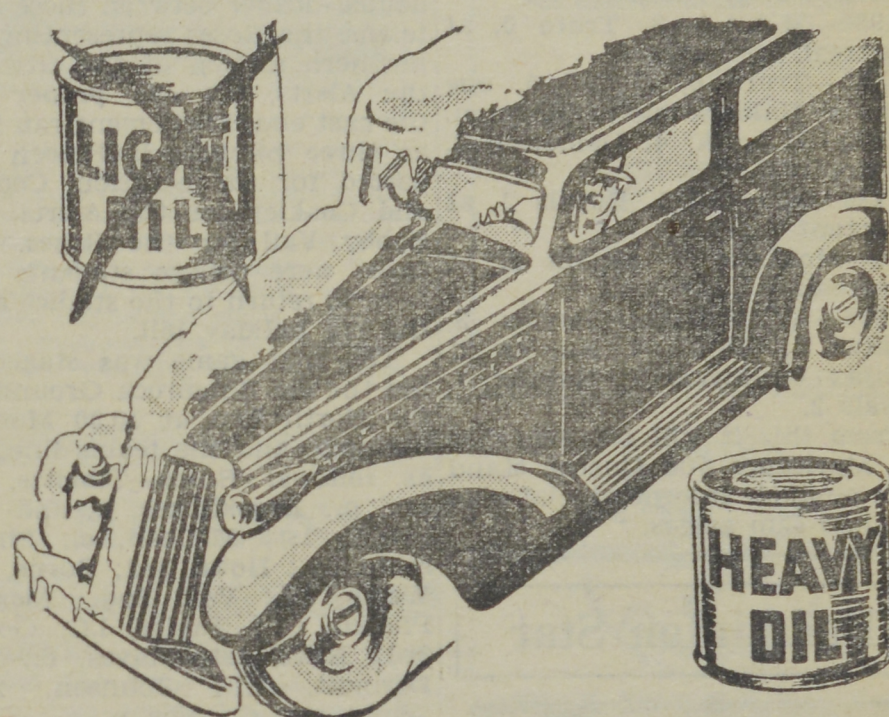
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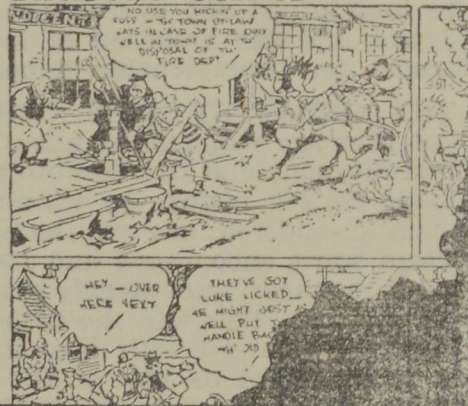
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
