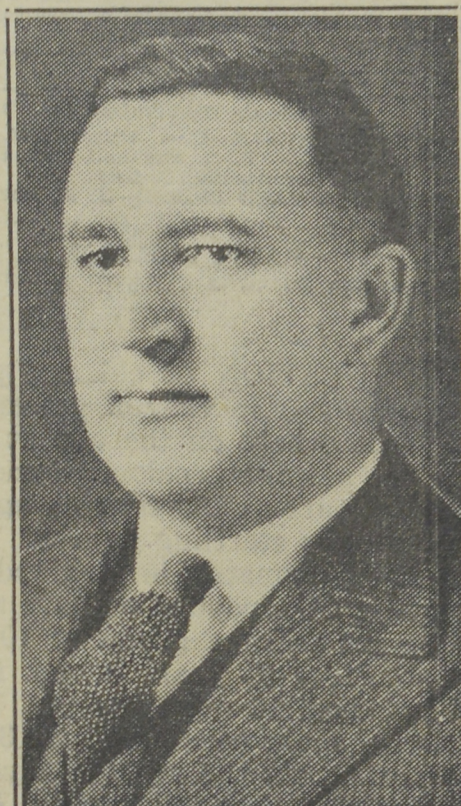

Saint John Streets Cleared Of Winter's Debris At Early Date

Department of Public Works Conducts Clean-Up Almost a Month Ahead of Usual Spring Effort.

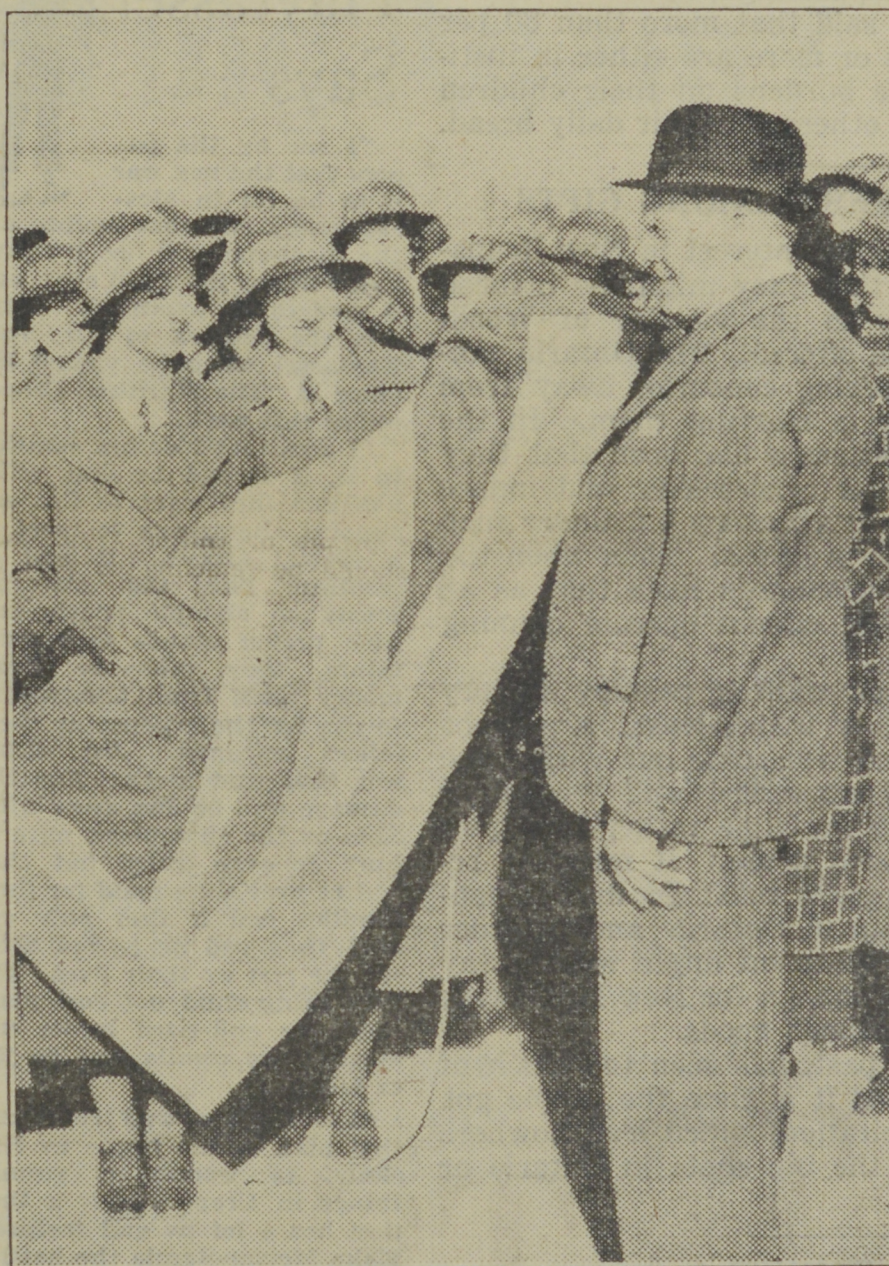
before the Saint John streets took on any semblance of spring. This year its a record for earliness, they say.

Tecumseh's Bones Said To Rest On Walpole Island

Plans Being Made To Erect Monument To Famous Indian Chief.

Windsor, Ont. — The elusive bones of Tecumseh, Indian chief, who died fighting for the British against the Americans in the battle of Moraviantown, October 5, 1813, were in the limelight again as a secret relating their whereabouts, reputedly hidden from white men and all but a few Indians for 85 years, was made known.

Chief Mee-Mee of the Ojibways, here to participate in the Canada Day ceremonies of the Michigan Exposition, declared that the bones of the great chieftain are at the Soldiers' Club on Walpole Island.

Despite all previous reports and claims regarding the resting place of Tecumseh's remains, Chief Mee-Mee says he is positive the bones at the Soldiers' Club are the genuine ones and they will be fittingly interred as soon as the financial arrangements are completed for a monument.

"This has not been told any white man," Chief Mee-Mee said. "Our fathers and grandfathers died with the secret locked inside them."

Chief Mee-Mee, huge, copper-skinned, has a general store and a pool room on Walpole Island.

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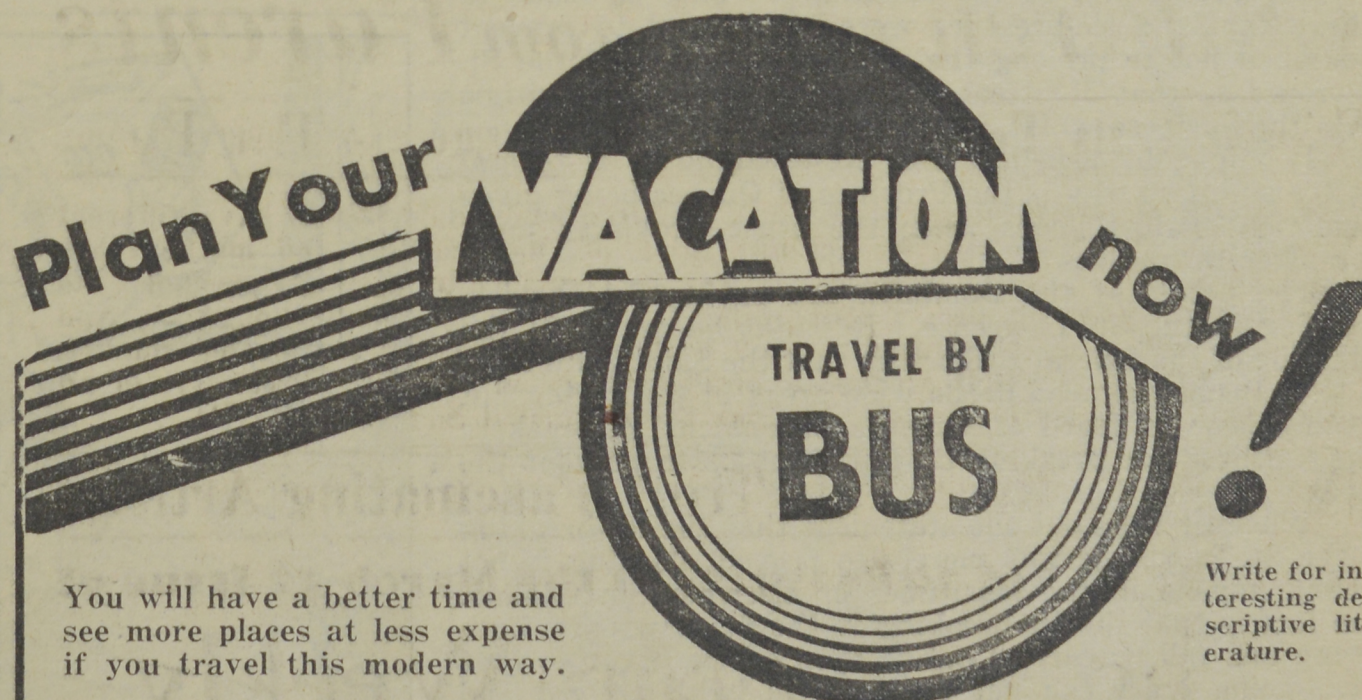
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
