Canadian Authors To Get Chance In Big Prize Contest

One Thousand Dollars Each For the Best Fiction and Non-Fiction Works.

Toronto.—Canadian literati will find encouragement in the announcement that a Canadian book contest is being organized by a Canadian and an American publishing house to run during the first six months of 1936.

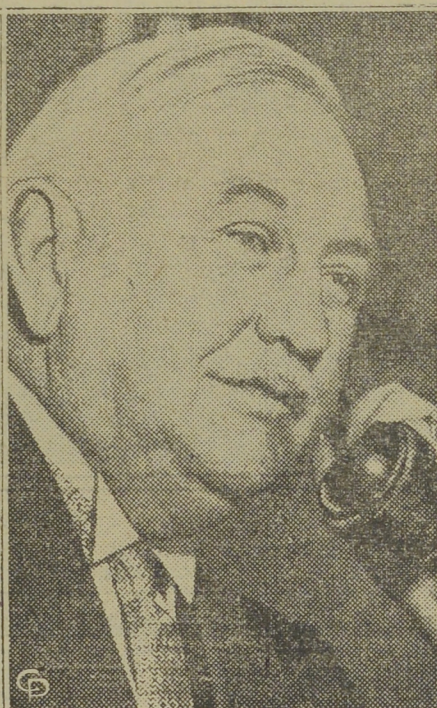
With the co-operation of the Canadian Authors' Association, George J. McLeod Limited and the Dodge publishing Company are offering \$1,000 each for the best fiction and non-fiction works by Canadian authors. The contest is open to any Canadian citizen and the prize money will be paid within a month as part of advance royalties.

The contest should be a decided asset to Canadian literature offering as it does an opportunity to Canadian writers seldom experienced. Usually, Canadian authors must compete against the huge field in the United States and stories about Canada are naturally not as greatly appreciated. This time, the contest will be distinctly Canadian.

HOUSEWIVES' DILEMMA

Berlin.—A new servant problem has been created in Germany by the Nuremberg anti-Jewish laws which forbade Jews to employ Aryan domestic servants in their household under 35 years of age. The value of maids over 35 years has suddenly risen, and as the result of a number of them leaving Aryan families to accept tempting offers from Jewish households, capable "over 35's" are now at a premium. Many Jewish families who have been unable to find servants over the minimum age have had to move into hotels or boarding houses.

Automobile Brakes Are Self-Adjusted By New Invention

British Engineers Try Out New Device That Is Successful.

Birmingham.—Two engineers of the tramways and omnibus department of the Birmingham corporation have patented an invention which may make them famous throughout the motoring world.

C. E. T. Rowland, chief engineer, and his assistant, H. Parker, have had remarkable results on the city's omnibus fleet with their device, which makes it unnecessary to adjust brakes manually throughout the life of the brake linings.

This may mean anything from 30,000 to 60,000 miles. In these

days it is not uncommon for brake linings to last as long as the car.

The adjusting mechanism is built into the nose of the brake shoe. It consists of a sliding wearing piece, which is extended by a worm reduction gear automatically operated by a rack and wheel.

It is claimed that the driver of any car using this type of brake would be able to drive without paying any attention to adjustments until the actual linings of the brakes were worn away.

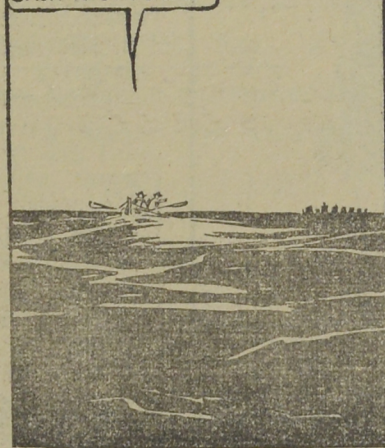

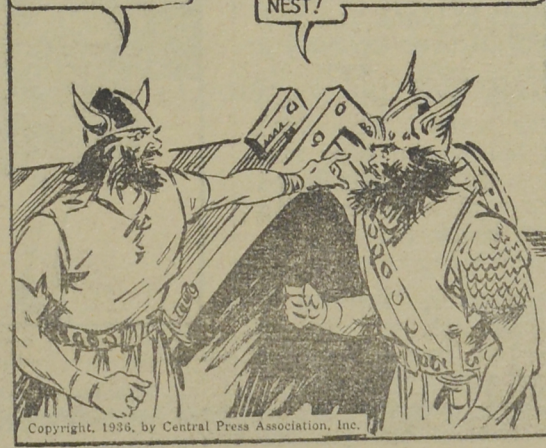

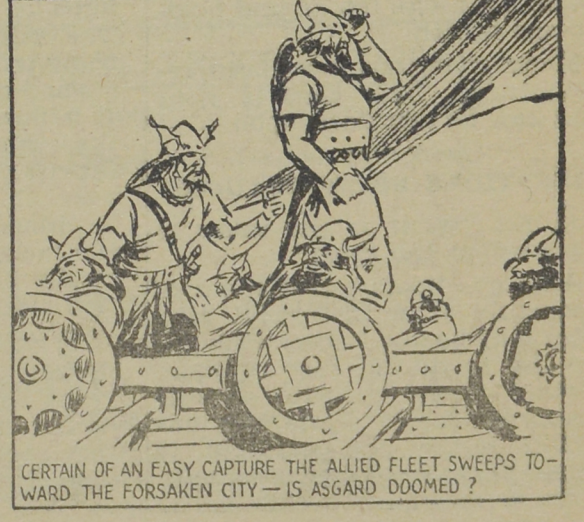
