MEMORANDA.
Brig Brunswick, Pickance, from this port, arrived at Jamaica, on the 30th April.
The Victory, from Quebec, at Halifax, spoke on the 12th, off Bique, brig Susan, of St. Andrews, 34 days from Jamaica.

Miramichi. May 31.—One hundred and thirty-five square rigged vessels have arrived in this port, since the opening of the navigation.
The Three Sisters have brought in the crew of the Catharine, Northwick, of Aberdeen, which vessel foundered in lat. 51, 20, long. 27.

Shipwreck.—On the 7th May between the Magdalen Islands and Cape Britain, the William of Whitehaven, Captain Black, for Richibucto, struck a field of ice, which stove in the bows of the vessel, and the crew and passengers had just time to save their lives by taking to the boat, without water, and only a small piece of beef, on which fourteen persons had to subsist three nights and four days. On the fourth day, in a state of great exhaustion, they were picked up by a Maryport vessel bound to Miramichi—one of the passengers a person advanced in years, died on the fourth day, and all suffered severely from cold and hunger.

Schr. Argus, Washington, arrived at New York, June 19, having on board Mr. McKinney, mate, and the crew, of the Brig Lord Exmouth, capsized, 4th inst. on her voyage from Jamaica to Halifax, in ballast in lat. 37, long. 74.—The masts were carried away and the decks swept of every thing—the righted on the 5th, when the crew were taken off by the Schr. John Burke, Garrettson, from Dominica, arr. at Newbern.
