

OBITUARY.

On the 1st inst. on board the brig Thomas Hanford, on her passage from Madeira, Mr. ALEXANDER SMITH, Seaman, a native of Guisborough, England.

On the 18th ult. at the Medicinal Springs in the State of N. York, JAMES ARCHER, A. M. in his 24th year. He was born in the immediate neighbourhood of Dundee, Scotland, and having early had his views pointed to the Church he completed the requisite Grammar School education at an excellent Seminary in that town, from whence he went to the University of St. Andrews, where he studied with great assiduity and success under several distinguished Professors among whom was Dr. John Hunter, who has been pronounced the first Philologist of the age. At the end of four Sessions he took his Degree of Master of Arts. He then entered on his Theological Studies, and in the course of other five years having finished the prescribed course of preparation for the pulpit, and passed his various pieces of trial with high approbation, he was licensed to preach the Gospel by the Presbytery of St. Andrews, according to the rites of the Established Church. Having no Ecclesiastical Preference, he did not receive Ordination (which alone qualifies to dispense the Sacraments, &c.) but came to this country recommended by Dr. Duncan of Ruthwell, (the founder of the Savings Bank system) in consequence of an engagement with Judge Ritchie of Annapolis, to finish the education of his family. On his arrival at this Port little more than a year ago, he officiated one Sunday in the Scotch Church much to the satisfaction of all who heard him, and he was not long at the place of his destination before he secured the warm esteem not only of the family with whom he lived, but also of every one in the circle in which he moved who had the good fortune to become acquainted with him. He was not of a robust constitution, but enjoyed perfect health till about Christmas last, when he was unexpectedly seized with bleeding from the lungs, which brought on a rapid consumption. As soon as the weather admitted of his taking a sea voyage, he came to this city on his way to the United States, where he was led to think that his health might be restored; but it was evident to all who saw him that the seasons of life were running low indeed. He himself was not buoyed up with very flattering hopes of recovery, even before he resolved on an immediate removal to the westward, for in a letter dated Annapolis, N. S. 25th April, he thus expressed himself, "I am at last driven to the conclusion that this climate will never do for my constitution. If it is the will of God to restore me to good health again in the course of the ensuing summer, I have no alternative but to part in peace with the country and all that it contains by autumn and seek a shorter and milder winter in lower latitudes."

The world was all before them where to choose
"Their place of rest,"—and Providence their guide.
If such is not his will I shall lament it more on account of another than of myself, namely, a worthy and aged mother whose grey hairs it would bring down with sorrow to the grave!" Such were the feelings of his mind as they were unobscured by his friend in this city who now experiences a melancholy pleasure in paying this last tribute of respect to the memory of an accomplished scholar, a sound moralist and Divine, an amiable and pleasing companion.
