From the Saint Andrew's Herald.

The following is an extract from a message sent by the Governor of Massachusetts (Levi Lincoln) to the Senate and House of Representatives, on Friday the 3d inst.

"Through the attention of Hon. Mr. Lloyd, one of the Senators of this State in the Congress of the U. States, I have been furnished with a copy of a letter addressed to him and his colleague, the Hon. Mr. Mills, from the Department of State, under date of the 23d ultimo, covering an answer to the Charge de Affairs from Great Britain, to the complaints of alleged encroachments upon the lands of Massachusetts and Maine, by certain subjects and settlers of the Province of New Brunswick. It must excite deep surprise to learn from this communication, that the claim to territory and sovereignty on the part of the British authorities is now enlarged far beyond what has heretofore been considered the undisputed title and actual possession of the Government and Citizens of the United States, and involves the interest and property of this Commonwealth and the State of Maine, to a most serious and alarming extent. It cannot be doubted that it will be met, on the part of the United States, with such just remonstrance and denunciation of unfounded assumption, as will induce to its immediate relinquishment, and the protection of the rights and property of the Government and people of the state respectively, and of the nation. Considering the subject as of the first importance, I have deemed it my duty, promptly to present it to your notice."
