Our latest English date is London, 23d April. By the Washington we received on Thursday last, our files of Boston papers down to the 31st ult. but they contain nothing new.

His Excellency the LIEUT. GOVERNOR, sailed from hence for Annapolis, N. S. on Saturday last in the Revenue Cutter Elizabeth, Capt. M'MASTER.

The Sixth Annual General Meeting of the New Brunswick Auxiliary Bible Society, will be held in Mr. COOPE's long room at 12 o'clock on Monday next, the 13th inst. The friends of the Institution, of both sexes, are earnestly invited to attend.

Court of Vice Admiralty.

An interesting and important case came on before the Court of Vice-Admiralty holden at the City Hall here on Saturday last, His Honor Judge Peters on the Bench. It related to the seizure of the Brigantine *Young Norval*, built in this Province, near the Lines, and bought, when on the Stocks, by Mr. Robert Stirling, of this City, Merchant, who was the Claimant in this cause. It appeared that a Permit had been obtained at the Custom-house of St. Andrews upon which said vessel came to this port, but that on application having been made by Mr. Stirling to the Collector of His Majesty's Customs for the purpose of having her registered, he was refused, on the grounds that she was built by, for, and on account of an American citizen, and that part of her materials were of American manufacture. On the same grounds the seizure took place. C. F. Street, Esq. Advocate General, conducted the pleadings on the part of the Crown—W. B. Kinnear, Esq. on the part of the Claimant. After various Depositions had been read, and a long argumentation had taken place in support of the Prosecution, His Honor the Judge advised its being withdrawn, on the ground that the case had not come into Court in such a shape as to admit of his giving a decision upon it, inasmuch as the seizure had been made before the vessel had been registered and thus put into such a situation as to admit of her performing any act as a British vessel, and that were he to order her to be registered, the Officers of Customs might act on the Decree or not as they thought proper, the matter being beyond his jurisdiction. The Court admitted the case to be a very hard one, in as far as relates to the claimant, who though entirely innocent in the whole transaction, had lost the use of the vessel for several months, and had been put to great expense and trouble; but it was stated that he has full recourse upon the guilty person from whom he had made the purchase, and as there was no designed oppression on the part of the seizing officers, His Honor was pleased to grant the usual Certificate to save them from being liable for expenses incurred.

LAUNCH.—On Thursday last, a Ship of nearly 400 Tons, called the CASSANDER, was launched from Mr. Owens' Building Yard Portland. She is owned by Mr. COOPER, of Port Glasgow, and is a most substantial, well built, and handsome vessel.

Inquests.—On the 1st of June, a Coroner's Inquest was held in the Parish of Lancaster, on view of the Body of a man unknown, (supposed to be John McDonald,)—Verdict—Found Drowned.

On the 3d June, a Coroner's Inquest was held at Carlton, on view of the Body of James Thornton.—Verdict—Accidental Death by Drowning.
