(Review of Reviews.) Socialism is today politically a minority party in every European country. Yet what is it doing? In Austria it has brought the proud house of Hapsburg to the ground. In Belgium it has compelled the conservatives to insure the unemployed and to enact some of the most advanced legislation in the world outside of Australia and New Zealand. In these two countries it is creating, in the first, a co-operative commonwealth, while in the latter it has almost done so. In Great Britain it is a desperate effort to dominate municipal policy, makes of London, in some respects, the greatest socialist city of the world, and makes King Edward the most despotic monarch in the world.
