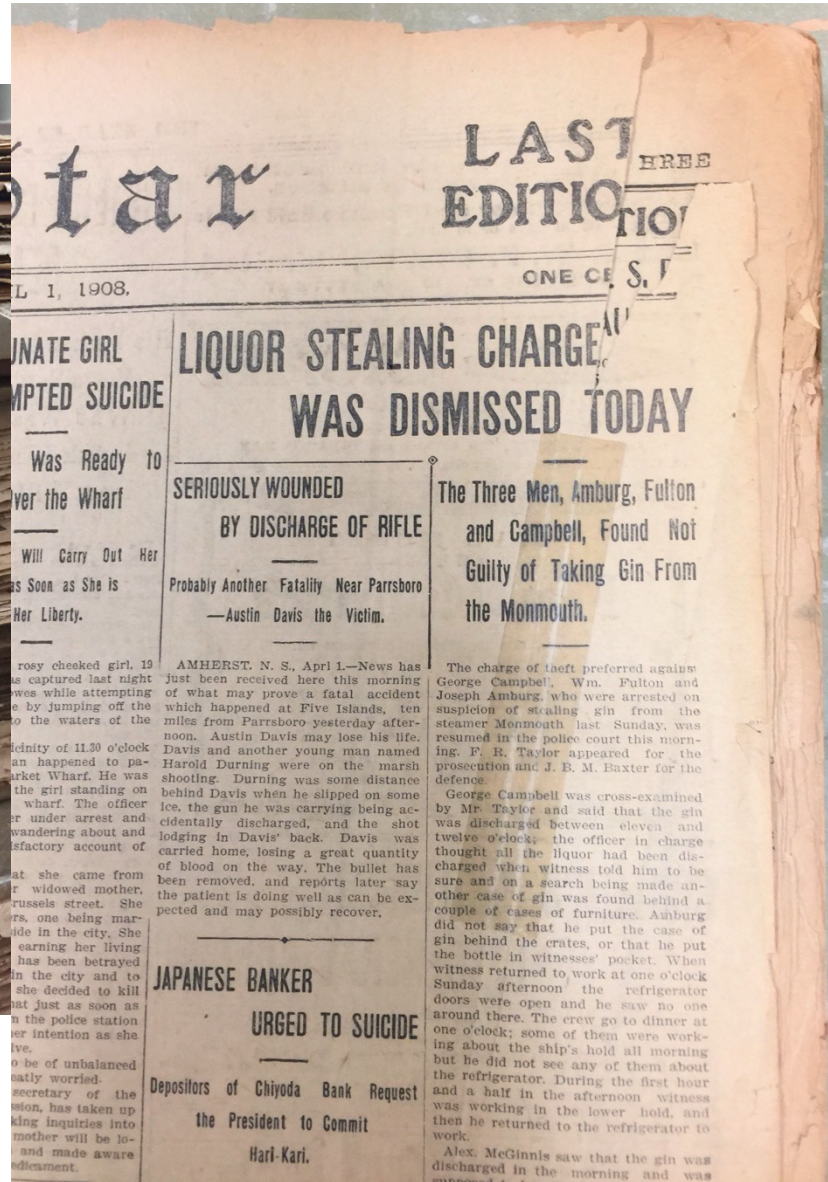


SELECTION AND COPYRIGHT

- CRKN / Clark Wilson LLP Analysis
 - **Pre-1913:** Low Risk
 - **1913-1931:** Moderate Risk
 - **Post 1931:** High Risk
- Further “due diligence” questions to consider:
 - Is the publication still in circulation? Is the publisher still active?
 - Does the publisher have a history of trying to enforce copyright?
 - Is the publication being used in another commercial product?
- Titles and issues must be evaluated on a case-by case basis

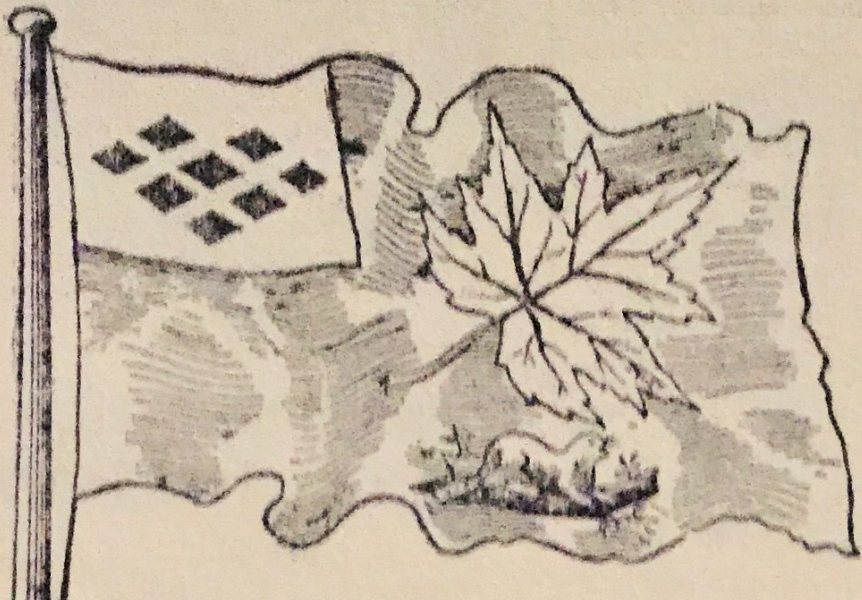

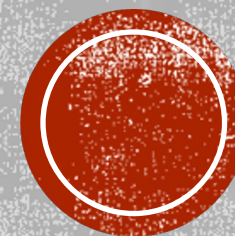

Dock Laborers in the Old Country Threaten To Tie up Every Port

Shipping Companies Working Today With Fervish Haste to Clear Cargoes Before the Blow Falls—Deadlock Has Existed Since February 1st—Little Hope of Settlement.

(By Percy M. Searl, British United Press Staff Correspondent) LONDON, February 15.—One million dock workers prepared today to quit work tomorrow and tie up every port in the United Kingdom, unless a last minute settlement cancels the strike orders.

CONFERENCE BEING HELD

Dockworkers, executives and employers were in conference seeking to break the deadlock that has existed since February 1. The threatened strike is national in scope. It was held at a meeting of national delegates representing the Transport and General Workers Union (200,000) members, the National Union of General Workers (443,000), the National Amalgamated Union of Labor (470,000) United Order of General Laborers (150,000), Amalgamated Society of Engineers, Marine Firemen, Electricians, etc. (40,000) and other similar organizations. The means complaint is that wages since 1920 have fallen from 16 shillings a day in the large ports and 15 shillings a day in the small ports to ten shillings and nine shillings respectively.

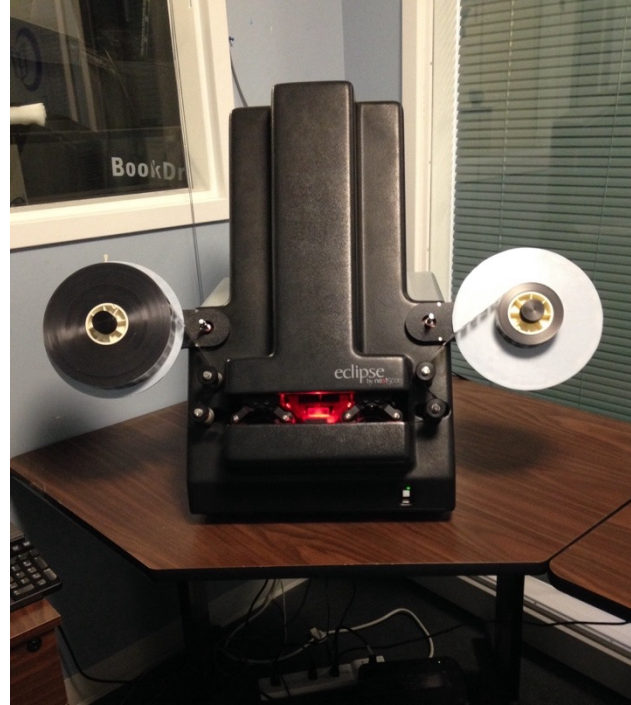

Steps:

1. Issue Discovery
2. Page OCR
3. Issue Creation, Page Ingest
4. DZI Tile Generation
5. PDF Generation
6. Issue Audit

1. ISSUE DISCOVERY, OCR QUEUEING

- We begin with a tree of scanned issues in a standardized format.
 - Structure/Naming/Metadata.
- Search for all subfolders that contain a metadata file, which is assumed to be an issue's path.
- Search for all images in that folder and assume they are each pages from that issue.
- Check if each image has an associated .hocr file generated. If not, the image is queued for OCR with Tesseract in a later step.
 - We queue instead of OCR immediately to optimize core usage - some issues have a small number of pages. This would leave cores unused.
- Convert the metadata to JSON format for assertion to the Drupal REST API.



2. PAGE OCR

- OCR:
 - Tesseract 5.x
 - <https://github.com/unb-libraries/docker-tesseract>
- Spawn 12-16 docker containers to simultaneously process pages (Based on PC hardware/cores).
- (Setting `OMP_THREAD_LIMIT=1` showed a slight performance improvement vs scheduler).
- For efficiency, issues are not created via the REST API until all pages in the queue are complete.
- We store .hocr files with images in the tree.



3. ISSUE CREATION, PAGE INGEST

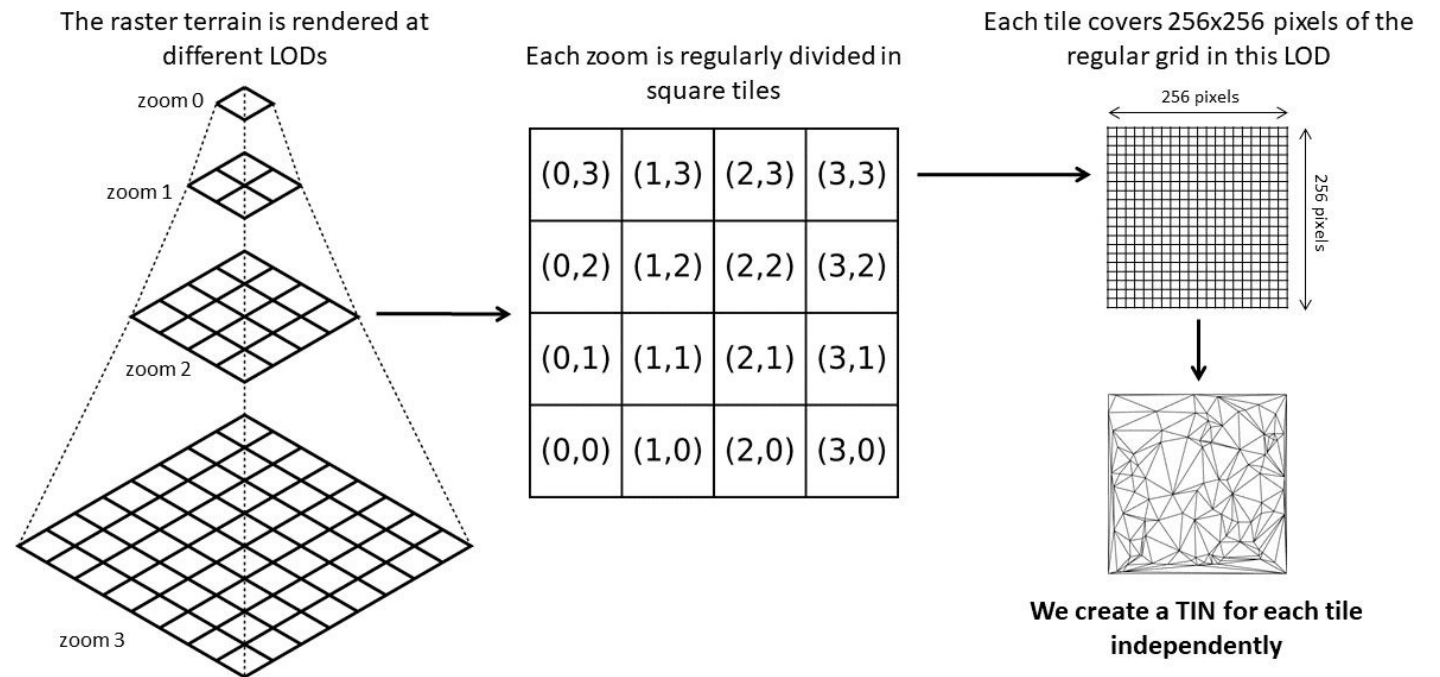
Once the OCR is complete:

- We iterate over the issues and create them on the site via the Drupal REST API.
- Create the pages and attach them to the issue.
- Add OCR text to the Drupal page entities.
- For resiliency, we write a marker file inside the subfolder to indicate the issue has been ingested.



4. DZI TILE GENERATION

- The page viewer: OpenSeadragon
- DZI 'tiles' are then pre-generated to minimize bandwidth and user load times.
 - The user is only required to download enough of the image to see clearly at the current zoom.



5. PDF GENERATION

- PDFs are Generated using Tesseract
- Provides an OCR-rich download option.
- (Similar process to OCR.)



6. ISSUE AUDIT

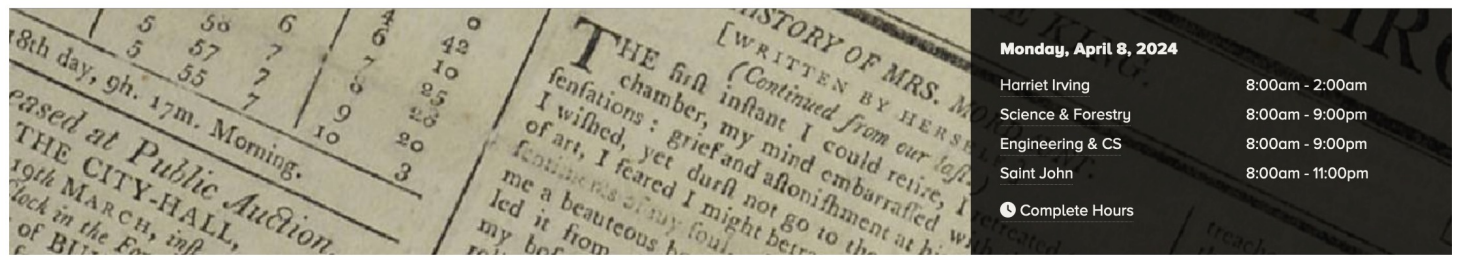
- Audit Metadata
- Hash remote images, compare to local files.
- Check page numbering
- Identify missing assets

- Multi-threaded processes set to use 12 threads.
- Average total ingest/dzi/pdf/audit time:
 - ~60s per page
- No Orchestration. Can scale horizontally to accommodate volume.

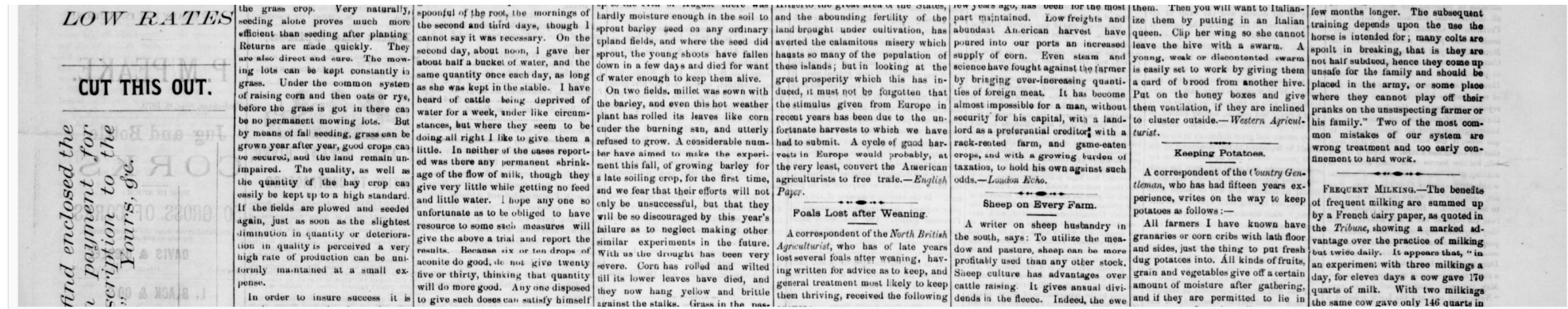
